VISITING WITH FARMERS

The Capital Journal has a large circulation in Eastern Polk county and the editor spent Saturday driving and visiting in the Polk county hills. A drive through pretty, picturesque Eola is like entering the gates of Paradise.

Up Into The Hills. The drive to Oak Grove skirts along the hills north of Eola and is along a very good road. There are not many improvements here. The farms are large, are mostly rented and grown to grain.

At one house where we canvassed the man had no use for a daily paper of any kind. He had bushy whiskers and seemed too busy to do anything but smoke a pipe.

The Oak Grove Neighborhood. Fall grain is looking well in the hills. Spring grain is needing rain badly. Gus Larsen and Gusie Williams have each a prune orchard, with a good crop prospect.

T. J. Stevens has 70 acres, 5 acres in early potatoes, 5 acres in late, 4 acres in apples, several acres in strawberries and black and Logan berries.

The wheat acreage about McCoy has fallen off over one-half and the country is going into dairying and fine sheep. Geo. L. Kelly and his father of McCoy were of the first to go into clover.
