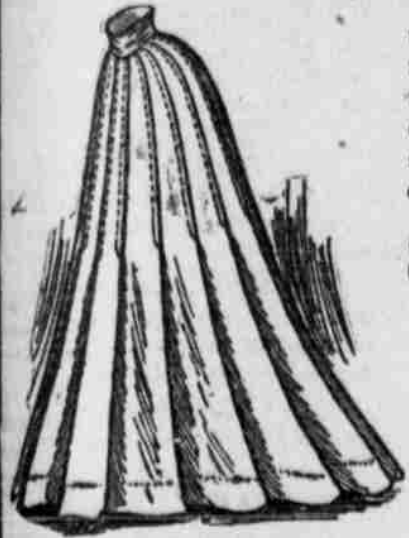

WATER RIGHTS

The Denver News says of the opinion of Justice Brewer on the national reclamation act and the authority of the government to take charge of and reclaim the arid lands of the country:

The opinion of the supreme court of the United States in the Kansas-Colorado water suit is attracting widespread attention in the west, because of its bearing upon the public lands question which is to be discussed at the convention to be held in Denver June 18, 19 and 20. The whole public lands question hinges upon the constitutional right of the general government in the control and use of these lands within the state.

While Judge Brewer's opinion in the water suit advances no new definitions regarding the constitution, it reiterates a number of important decisions of the court heretofore handed down and discusses the theory of the constitution at some length.

The court puts especial emphasis upon the fact that this is a government of enumerated powers. One of the powers that is not possessed by the national government is that of sovereignty within a state. The national government has no power to enact a law that attempts to override the law made by the state in the legitimate exercise of local sovereignty.

This point is of the utmost importance in view of the fact that the claim is made that the United States is in fact today attempting to override and exercise local sovereignty upon the forest reserves within the western states.

The withdrawal of all timber lands within a state and the merchandising of the timber thereon, it is now claimed, is not authorized by any clause of the constitution.

It is known the government has made a rule with the force of law, that cattle or horses straying upon reserved lands of the government constitutes trespass.

Under this order, the federal government has assumed local sovereignty upon its reserved lands within the state without the consent of the state by making laws providing for the government of citizens of the state upon such lands and authorizing

ing officers of the United States to make arrests for the violations of such laws and to try persons so arrested in the United States courts, thus, it is claimed, establishing a separate government within the state.

Rush to New El Dorado.

County Assessor J. E. Loggan has returned to Burns from an official tour of the southern part of Harney county and report great excitement in the Denio country over the discovery of rich copper finds in the Pueblo mountains, where heavy prospecting is now in progress, and there is expectation of big development this year.

Already the well-known mining operators, Nixon and Winters, who have been prominent in Nevada mining circles for some years, are on the ground and are enthusiastic over the immediate possibilities.

"Shorty" Cooper, the man who discovered and made a fortune out of the Manhattan mines, in the Goldfield district, is also there, and declares the formation exactly similar to that of the region where he made his pile. The prediction is made by those men and others who are inter-

ested that there will be thousands of men in there before the summer passes, and that the field of operations will rival the Goldfield district in its best days.—Prineville Review.

Hail Storm at Redmond.

A fearful hail storm visited the region between Redmond and O'Neill Friday afternoon, doing considerable damage to crops, although it is believed the damage is not permanent. Hail stones large as walnuts struck the growing grasses and vegetables, bowling them over as though tramped down by cattle, and the life of any one out in the storm was jeopardized by the falling ice. So far as we have been able to learn no lives were lost, either human, or live stock. The storm lasted for half an hour, and was especially severe a mile this side of Redmond, where the ground was literally buried beneath the storm of hail stones.

Sustains City.

In the case of N. Moffitt and C. J. Olmstead as garnishee against the city of Salem, Judge Galloway Saturday affirmed the decision of City Recorder Moores, holding that the city had authority to collect poll tax, and adjudging that Moffitt pay \$3 to the city as poll tax and \$3.75 costs.

Drowned Twenty-eight.

Barbadoes, Lesser Antilles, June 10.—Twenty-eight passengers were drowned by the sinking of the French schooner La Jalouse, from Cayenne for St. Louis, Senegambia, off the Barbadoes Friday.

Woodburn Beat St. Johns.

The game at Woodburn Sunday between Woodburn and St. Johns resulted in a victory for the former by a score of 4 to 3.

Russian Famine Nearing End.

The Russian famine committee has notified its representatives in London and New York that the time has arrived to cease agitation for foreign subscriptions, as Russia is now able to care for her own people.

Prince Lvoff said recently that assistance sent to Finland from Great Britain and the United States had done inestimable good and been a mighty weapon to force the Russian government to do its duty. With the latest douma appropriations the aid given by the state totals \$87,000,000, of which \$6,000,000 will be devoted to fighting the scurvy in Ufa province and elsewhere, and in maintaining eating places. These eating places at present number 30,000, and are feeding 2,500,000.

Prince Lvoff said the outlook for the harvest in Central Russia was the most promising of a dozen years. There had been a plentiful rainfall, and the temperature has been excellent for the growing crops.
