GAMBLERS PERSISTENT.

The federal authorities are doing their share in the suppression of gambling.

The National Honduras lottery has been put out of business, at least for the present, and its officers and members having been convicted in Alabama of conspiracy to cause the interstate carriage of lottery advertisements.

The Honduras was a successor of the Louisiana state lottery, against which the government directed a fight for years, and which was finally put out of business.

After the use of the United States mails was forbidden, the Louisiana lottery USED THE EXPRESS COMPANIES TO DISTRIBUTE TICKETS.

When a stop was put to this, the Honduras matter was carried as personal baggage by agents of the company.

While the decision of the federal court puts the Honduras out of business and destroys its books and paraphernalia, it is expected that the lottery business will be tried in some other form.

GAMBLERS ARE AS INGENUOUS AS CORPORATION ATTORNEYS IN DEVISING SCHEMES TO KEEP ABREAST OR AHEAD OF LEGISLATURES.

The Chicago gamblers have a floating poolroom on Lake Michigan that carries them beyond the reach of the authorities, so the juries have decided.

In inland cities where poolroom betting has been barred, the gamblers go about with little books in their pockets, in which they record bets, and they get the results of the races over the telephone.

The gambler is like the municipal grafter. He may be suppressed for a time, but he will reappear.

A CASUS BELLI.

Taft has been fortunate up to this time in confining outspoken opposition chiefly to the women folk, who do not vote in the great majority of states.

The wife of Lieutenant Colonel Ayres is quoted as saying the letter from the secretary of war to her husband forbidding her trespassing on the reservation at West Point "is so insulting that I will not repeat it or show it."
