KING OF CHICKEN RAISERS

Linn County Man Who Makes Poultry Pay

W. J. Riblin, of Halsey, has utilized six acres of land and the sheds of an abandoned tile factory, and converted it into one of the most successful poultry yards in Oregon. He has 600 hens (no males) and at an expense last year of \$400 he turned off \$990 cash, besides considerable in the way of a living. He buys yearling hens at 50 cents each, and keeps them laying until they are old and fat, and then sells them dressed. The big sheds make splendid winter yards and laying pens. A coating of carbolineum once a year keeps the roosts free from vermin, but he says, to make poultry a success, a man has to keep busy among his hens. They will not stand neglect. Anyone wishing detailed information better go up and visit the Riblin yards at Halsey. Mr. Riblin has a neat home and makes more cash off his six acres than some men off a quarter section.

Artesian Well Near Lewiston.

A flow of artesian water has started in a well of the Lewiston Oil & Development Company on the Porter place, and the phenomenon is attracting wide attention and comment. The well was put down several years ago to the depth of 985 feet in an attempt to develop oil. The drill was still in the basalt, and had some difficulty in operating among fissures when the last work was done.

The flow started yesterday, and the water is now gushing about three feet above the ground in a stream that is from four to five inches. The theory is that the pressure of water from the artesian supply below has opened the fissure and that the water is forced into the pipes. It now seems probable that there is an ample supply of artesian water below the basalt formation, and that the present well, if deepened until the cap was pierced through, would develop a gusher.

Government engineers have examined the Lewiston valley for artesian water, and their report is to

the effect that water could be found in great abundance here if the basalt could be pierced. The basin is large and the pressure would be great enough to force the supply where it could be utilized by a gravity system.—Lewiston Teller.

Bridge Collapsed.
