Camphor Growing in the United States.

Secretary James Wilson of the Department of Agriculture, in a recent address before the American Club of Pittsburgh, declared that the United States was successfully experimenting in the production of camphor. He said in part:

"For years the department has been distributing camphor tree seed, and thousands of trees are now growing throughout the South and in the Pacific Coast states. Two years ago a serious effort was made to develop the manufacture of camphor from these trees. By improvements in manufacturing processes satisfactory results have been accomplished and a large manufacturing concern is now building up a camphor grove of 2000 acres in Florida, from which it hopes to make its camphor. This firm uses more than \$500,000 worth of camphor every year.

A Japanese newspaper states that the Tokio government has on foot a project for the extensive planting of

forests of camphor trees. The demand for camphor increases, having now reached over 10,500,000 pounds annually, and it will not be long until it reaches 13,000,000 pounds says the Japanese authority.

SAVED BY A MIRACLE.

Horribly Scalded But Carried Out of Danger by a Belt.

When a large steam pipe in the plant of the Lebanon paper mill burst yesterday afternoon while R. L. Smith, the chief engineer, was engaged in making repairs upon it, a swift moving belt through a miraculous chance carried the badly scalded and unconscious man out of danger, in all probability saving his life.

According to a telephone message from Lebanon yesterday, Engineer Smith had just discovered that one of the large steam pipes was leaking and had climbed upon an improvised platform, to where the break was, and was engaged in making the necessary repairs. Directly behind him and below ran a wide belt which aids in driving the machinery in that part of the mill. Without warning the pipe suddenly burst and Smith was deluged with steam and hot water. The man's arms, shoulders and one leg were fearfully scalded, and he fell backward unconscious onto the wide belt, which bore his body out of danger, and finally threw him onto the floor. A few minutes later workmen in the mill, attracted by the sound of escaping steam, discovered the engineer lying on the floor. A physician was at once summoned and the injured man was given medical aid. It is thought he may recover. It is said that had the belt not carried the engineer's body out of the escaping steam, both eyes would have been put out by the scalding water. Smith's home is said to be in the Siuslaw country. He has an uncle, W. W. Smith, at Monmouth.—Albany Herald.

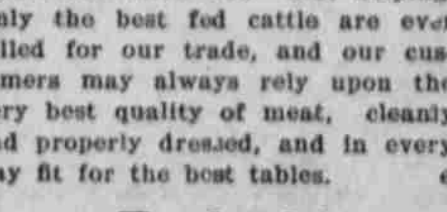

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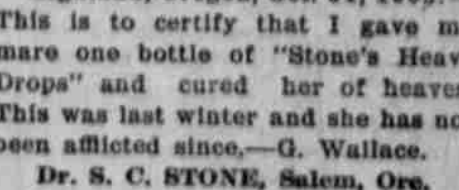
