> "'It take it,' declared the court, 'that, in law, marriage is a meritorious and a necessary institution. The propagation of the race, the sustaining of the family and the upbuilding of society rests upon it. It is therefore to be promoted.'

"Following out this reasoning the judge could not see what the legislature was endeavoring to acomplish when it made the one-year limitation. The law, in his opinion, was a mere arbitrary fixing of period without any reason, and against publie policy. To deprive any man or woman of the right to marry, except upon consideration of age, health or wrongdoing was held to be a violation of natural rights. Judge McEwen declined to recognize as illegal the marriage of a divorced woman which had occurred inside of the prohibited time limit.
