**A RAILROAD**  
To Be Built from Corvallis to the  
Alsea Country.

If all plans work out, Corvallis will soon have another railroad. The initial shipment of rails for the track is expected to arrive by tonight's freight. It consists of four cars, and it is to be followed by an additional six cars to be transferred in Portland today.

Fifteen miles of rail are enroute. Surveyors are now at work locating the line. They have been in the field on preliminary surveys and otherwise for four weeks.

The road is to run from Corvallis along the foothills via Muddy and Bellfountain and thence to the headwaters of the Alsea river. It passes then to Blachly postoffice in the Lake Creek country on the headwaters of the Sluslaw, and will be 38 miles in length. The promoters announce that work will begin as soon as the right of way is secured, and the line finally located. It is to be standard gauge, and the section to the head of the Alsea, which is expected to be completed and in operation this fall, is estimated to cost \$225,000 or about \$9000 a mile.

The promoter of the road is Stephen Carver. He built the line from Ontario to Vale, in eastern Oregon, 16 miles in length. He bought the Medford and Crater Lake road at the first sale, and bought rails to complete that line.

Corvallis and adjoining country have already raised \$30,000, to be taken in stock.

The phenomenal part of the incident is that all the work was done without the facts becoming public. The work was almost wholly in secret, except where publicity was obviously necessary. The matter was handled through the Commercial club, with the following general committee, A. J. Johnson, Virgil E. Waters, Dr. Withycombe, J. R. Smith and W. D. DeVarney.—Times.

**Dead Baby Recovers.**  
Doctors sometimes disagree, as was illustrated in the case of little Robert Harding, infant son of an iron worker of the same name living on Eighty-fourth street, New York. Young Robert, fifteen months old, was pronounced dead by one physician; another brought the baby back to life.

Little "Bob" was held in his father's arms at dinner table. Being of an inquisitive nature, he decided to taste some of the steak which his father was eating. Unfortunately, it was a bone he placed in his baby mouth, and immediately fell to the floor, purple and grasping for breath.

Grabbing the infant, the father ran with him down the street, carrying the babe by the legs, head downward. A crowd gathered at the man's heels, retarding his progress and crying, "Hang him! He's cut the baby's throat." Escaping his enraged pursuers only after some diffi-

culty. Harding entered the Yorkville hospital, of which Dr. H. B. Sheffield is medical director, and cried for a physician. The first surgeon to appear, gazing upon the black face and limp body, pronounced the infant dead. In response to the matron's call Dr. Benjamin Freudenfall then appeared upon the scene. He stuck his finger down little Robert's throat and felt a piece of bone, which he later extracted with a pair of forceps. Oxygen was then administered and the baby soon recovered.

**WILL RAISE ASSESSMENT.**

Lane County Will Tax S. P. Lands \$8 an Acre.

Assessor B. F. Keeney informs the Guard that he has decided to double the assessment on the Southern Pacific company's congressional land in this county this year. Last year it was assessed on an average of \$4 an acre, and this year the average will be \$8. Some of the land the company owns in the county is absolutely worthless, while some of it is great deal more valuable than \$8 an acre, but the assessor concluded the latter figure would be a good average.

The assessment on the roadbed of the company's main line will also be advanced, and the total for the road bed and rolling stock will be \$19,000 per mile this year. Instead of \$18,000, as last year. He assessed the rolling stock last year at \$2000 per mile and the roadbed at \$17,000, making the total, \$19,000 but the board of equalization cut the assessment on the rolling stock down to \$1000, making a total of \$1000 less than the assessor did. Nineteen thousand dollars a mile is what the road is assessed at in Douglas, Linn and other counties in western Oregon as agreed upon at an assessors' convention a year ago, and Assessor Keeney intends to abide by the agreement made at that time.

The assessor is now going through the mortgage records of the county and has discovered that the county is losing a good many thousand dollars in tax money by property owners not giving in the credits of mortgages as required by law. He intends to assess all these credits this year, thereby adding a good sum to the tax collections.

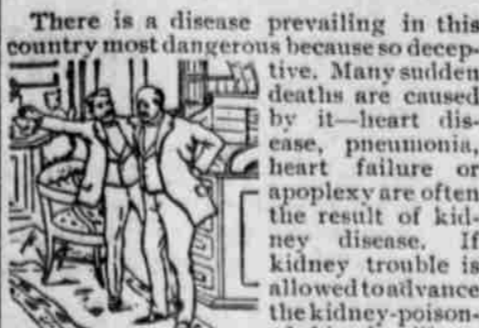
