**CHARGED WITH A HEINOUS CRIME**

Sequel to the Story of Girl Being Drugged at Eugene.

Yesterday morning The Register made mention of a young woman or girl having been arrested on South Willamette street in a condition of frenzy bordering on insanity, and stated that she acted like a woman who had been drugged. The sequel reveals a story of a crime which, if true, should be dealt with with the iron hand of the law, as its recital will make the blood of every mother boil with indignation.

The girl recovered her senses after she had slept, and on Thursday morning told her story to Deputy Sheriff C. C. Hammond and Prosecuting Attorney Skipworth, but the full details are withheld for prudential reasons. Her name is Emma Toole, and her parents live at St. Johns. She is only 17 years old, and came to Eugene with another girl—Pearl Gillingham. She says they were enticed to the Lewis & Clark lodging house by one Minnie Savage, and after having been drugged, her ruin was accomplished by the proprietor, William Arnold. He left town Wednesday evening, but returned again some time in the night, and was arrested and placed in jail yesterday and a charge of rape lodged against him. His preliminary hearing will be held in Justice Bryson's court some time today. Other arrests are to follow, and there appears to be serious trouble ahead for the woman and another man by the name of Mays—Eugene Register.
