ness course after graduating from the high school. It would obviously be to their advantage, if they could take their business course in conjunction with the high school course, and thus complete both in a first-class manner in the same time required for graduation from any of the high school courses. I submit the proposition to the board of directors as one worthy of careful consideration, and adoption, if found desirable and practicable.

"Regarding the matter of employing a supervisor of music and drawing for the Salem schools I can say with full confidence in the truth of the statement that such a supervisor is urgently needed. Hundreds of cities in this country half the size of Salem, and several in this state not over half the size of Salem, already employ a supervisor for these subjects. It would seem that there are no subjects in the school curriculum more necessary or important than these. But it is worse than useless to attempt to teach them without trained teachers and competent supervisors. It is possible to secure a competent supervisor for both of these subjects at a cost of about eight hundred dollars a year. I submit this proposition to the board in the hope that you will find a way to provide such instruction in the Salem schools during the coming year."

FAIRMOUNT SURRENDERS TO W. M. TEAM

Woolen Mills Go Up a Notch and Tie With Y. M. C. A.

It began to look as though there would be a scoreless game last evening in the five inning contest between the Fairmount nine and the Woolen Mills aggregation when after three and one-half innings had been played neither side had succeeded in getting a man over the home plate.

In the second half of the fourth inning Bowen, of the Woolen Mills, sent a hard drive to centerfield and scampered to first. Farmer who came up next had the misfortune, or good fortune to get a hit, thus sending him to first and Bowen to second. Bowen stole third and Farmer trotted down to second. There were two down when Melson went to the bat and the crowd awaited breathlessly for the result. Dause sent in one of his elusive drops which was caught fair on the willow club and driven far out in leftfield with no one under it. At this point the balloon went up. Bowen stretched his legs and crossed the tally line with Farmer right at his heels. Melson, who had saved the day went down to first like Jinks in his new auto and when the cloud of dust cleared away he had a grip on the third bag with both feet. The over-joyed boosters and everybody else waked up and rent the air with several war whoops which shook the grandstand.

Hatch grasped the big stick and swatted a fly which Carey nailed between first and second and this ended the scoring of the contest with two credits for the Woolen Mills and a string of goose eggs for the Fairmounts.

In the first inning Keaton, of the Fairmounts, scrambled down to first after giving the horsehide a small jolt and then stole second and third, where he left his bones as Cary who was at the bat when there were two down, could not get his lamps and upper extremities to work together in locating the ball.

Dause pitched a good game for the Fairmounts and kept his men guessing, and while both he and Bowen were hit several times it was not at critical moments, with the exception of Melson's drive.

The Woolen Mills and the Y. M. C. A. are now tied for second place and the contest between them will probably be a hard struggle.

Ormond Bean, of the University of Oregon, umpired the game.
