

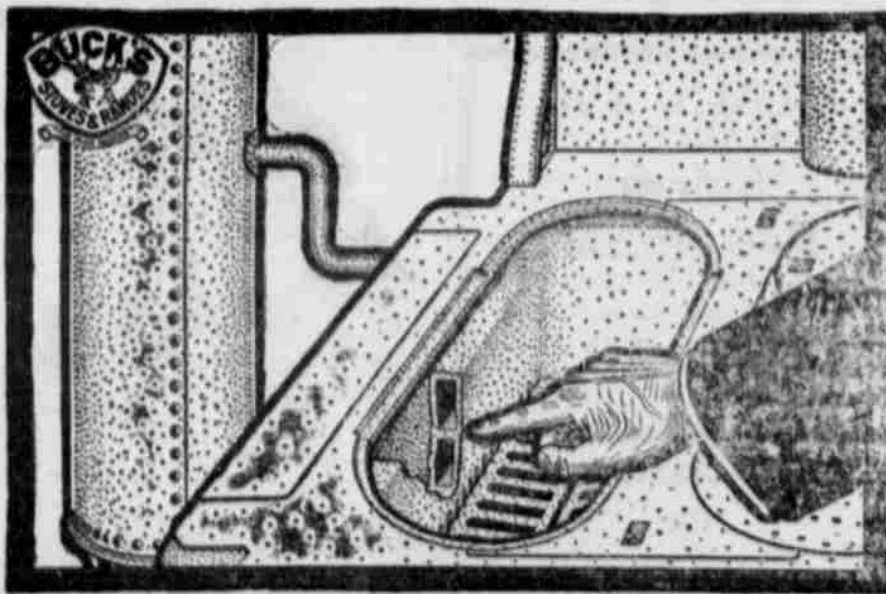

Ambulatory Agricultural Schools.
 B. H. Ridgely, consul-general at Barcelona, furnishes the following chapter on the new agricultural movement in Spain:

The general progressive movement in Spain—a movement which goes slowly but surely—is expected by a recent government order creating a sort of ambulating school for teaching scientific farming in the remote agricultural district of the country—a measure which may have a certain commercial significance in the United States, since it will probably develop a demand for better agricultural implements and machines than those now in use. The government order referred to provides for a course of experimental and practical instruction to be given every year by itinerant lecturers selected from among the agricultural engineers at the district schools of agriculture.

In the months of January and February of each year the directors

of these schools are required to report to the department of agriculture at Madrid, giving the program of lectures to be given during the ensuing twelve months with an estimate of the cost, including traveling expenses and remuneration of the teachers and transport of the agricultural machinery or appliances which it may be considered advisable to carry to those remote villages where the practical instruction is to be given.

So far only the schools of agriculture at Zaragoza, Jaen, Palencia, Badajoz and Barcelona and the two stations at Haro and Villafranca del Penedes are referred to in this order but if the movement prove a success it will, no doubt, be extended and must lead to a wider use of modern farming appliances in Spain.

General reports are to the effect that there will be a very fine hop crop harvested in western Oregon. There is plenty of labor to pick the crop on the theory that 150,000 bales were picked last year and there was talk of a shortage of labor then. There will be as many hops this year in Oregon if the crop is harvested. One thing that will cut the crop down is the difficulty renters are having in borrowing picking money, as banks have shut down on all such cases, except the land owner will join in the notes and give an option to sell the crop as soon as it is in the bale. Unless land-owners come to the relief of the renters many rented hop yards will go without picking.
