Adultery a Crime.

New York, Aug. 31.—The Phillips bill, which amends the penal code and makes adultery a crime in this state punishable as a misdemeanor, with a fine of \$250 or six months imprisonment in penitentiary or jail, or both, will become effective after today.

The anti-Pinkerton law, preventing the employment of private detectives in labor disputes and requiring special police to be appointed from the county wherein they are to be employed, also takes effect September 1.
