TO IMPROVE TRAIN SERVICE.
Main Run From Roseburg When No. 12 Is Late.

In the matter of the train service on the Southern Pacific the railroad commission today ordered as follows: The Southern Pacific shall keep the agents between the city of Ashland and Portland informed as to the progress of train No. 12, and that the train shall not arrive at Roseburg so that it can be dispatched from Roseburg within

two hours of its schedule time of departure from Roseburg, then the said company shall make up and dispatch a train from Roseburg to Portland on the schedule of train No. 12, which train shall make the stops train No. 12 is scheduled to make. This order goes into effect 20 days from date, or on Sunday, September 29. No. 12 is the northbound train due here at 4:45.

PENDLETON GETS A TRAIN.

Railroad Commission Orders Extra Train Service.
The railroad commission today made an order compelling the O. R. & N. to extend the service of the trains running between Portland and Biggs to Pendleton. Trains will leave Pendleton and Portland in the morning, and will as nearly as possible connect with trains on the Heppner branch, and the Columbia Southern, and the trains on the latter road must connect with both the west and eastbound trains on the main line.
