VARIOUS BANKING METHODS

(Continued from Page One.)
The Moore brothers, both directors of the bank, overdrew their accounts \$2020, and Cashier Morris withdrew his account \$1600.

Cashier Morris loaned himself \$1000 of the bank's money without authority or indorsement. The name of his family appears among the items of loans and discounts in the amount of \$20,000, to say nothing of other banks, railway, irrigation and other schemes which were borrowed or some member of his family interested.

John F. Shorey, Lefe Pence and John J. Jones others basked in the continuous sunshine of the bank's money, for sums both great and small.

"All Chadwicks Not Dead."
Finding a desire that the dead be allowed to bury its dead and that the thousands of creditors of the bank should ever look onward, toward, upward and toward the new scheme of reorganization, President H. Moore, of the Oregon Trust & Savings bank, remarked laconically, this morning that "all the Chadwicks are not dead yet."

He had the creditors asked by a Telegram man how possible for the single item of overdrafts to reach \$257,000 without let or hindrance, and who of the bank was or were responsible for the sorry state of affairs existing when the bank closed its doors.

Mr. Moore is deeply engrossed in the work of perfecting plans of reorganization, and does not care to make any statement touching on the receiver Devlin's report.

the cause for its suspension, the better it will be," added Mr. Moore. "Agitation in the papers, quarreling or mud-slinging among the officials of the bank would only work harm to the interests of those who now are trying to recover on their accounts, and whom we are trying to assist."

"Great interest has been taken by the bank's creditors in the plans for reorganization and reopening the bank's doors, and we look for still more interest in the future."

Mr. Moore's statement was clearly borne out for the headquarters of the depositors' committee in the Lafayette building have been crowded all forenoon today, and telephone inquiries are being made by the score.

While Receiver Devlin declines to make any statement as to his own views regarding the reorganization idea, it is understood he has stated that it would be the quickest way in which the creditors could realize on their accounts.

Devlin Says Little.
"In not making any comment or suggestion in my report," said Devlin, "I am simply acting under the instructions of the court. My chief purpose is to help the creditors get their money back as quickly as possible. I shall make no effort, however, to place the securities of the institution on the market until I have collected on the overdrafts, the loans and discounts and the accounts due from other banks."

That Mr. Devlin is acting for the best interests of the creditors in not trying to market any of the bank's securities is shown from the fact, as explained by a local stock and bond broker, that the bond market is practically dead throughout the country, effecting practically all

classes and issues, even from government, state, municipal and on down the line. This is due to the fact that all the available money usually in sight for investment purposes is employed in the present movement of this year's enormous crops, and what is not already working will be held in reserve until the bulk of the crops have been moved.

This is true of New York, Boston, Philadelphia and Chicago; everywhere, in fact. It is held probable that the bank's securities will find much readier market in the course of a few months than at present, and at the same time, should the movement toward reorganization progress as rapidly in the next few days, there will not be such a vast bulk of bonds and stocks for the open market to "digest" as there is now. This feature of clearing up the bank's affairs is of material assistance to the receiver in the matter of liquidation.

The depositors' committee has called another meeting of the creditors for next Saturday night, to be held at the Armory. All depositors and creditors are urged to be present, and express their opinions as to the plan for reopening the bank. Bank books or certificates of deposit must be presented at the door to gain admittance. The proposed plan of procedure, with explanation of its advantages, will be outlined in addresses by President E. W. Haines of the Oregon State Bankers' association and others.
