### FOOTBALL SEASON OPENED

#### Long Hair and Big Feet Now the Idols of the Sweet Young Girls

New York, Sept. 21.—Carlisle Indians opened the football season in the east today with a victorious struggle with the Albright college eleven on the Carlisle campus. Minor games were also played between Williams and Williston, Pennsylvania state and Altoona, and Bucknell and Mansfield.

At Yale, Harvard, Pennsylvania and others of the more important institutions the past week has been marked by the gathering of the gridiron heroes for the practice season, and as a result countless rumors are rife of the strength or weakness of the material from which the elevens must be made.

Next Friday the officials of the leading eastern institutions will meet in New York to pass on all disputes regarding the interpretation of rules governing the game. As the result of last year's experience, it is generally admitted that the new rules have effected a great improvement in the popular college game, and it is unlikely that any radical changes will be made.

Following Carlisle's lead today, Cornell will be the next big university to open its playing season, the first game having been scheduled for next Saturday with George Washington. Ten days will find Harvard and Yale in the field, both having scheduled games for October 2, the former with Bowdoin and the latter with Wesleyan. Pennsylvania also opens its season on that date with Villanova. Princeton will get into the game October 5, playing Stevens as an opener.

The Carlisle Indians have an exceedingly hard schedule, embracing 12 games, with Harvard, Princeton, Pennsylvania, Chicago and Minnesota among their future opponents

for gridiron honors. On the redskins will largely depend a test of the relative strength of the football teams of the east and the west, by means of the unsatisfactory method of comparative scores. Pennsylvania by playing Michigan, will furnish the only other test.

West Point begins its season October 5, meeting Franklin and Marshall, and the Annapolis boys will play Dickinson the same day. As usual, the army and navy will close the football season with a game at Philadelphia, November 30, being the date assigned for the annual struggle. West Point has cut off Harvard and Princeton from this year's schedule, although Yale has been retained, and an additional opponent secured in Cornell.

New York will have an opportunity to see two first class games this fall. The Princeton Tigers will be seen in both of them, playing Cornell here on October 26 and Carlisle on November 2. This will be the Indians' first appearance in the metropolis in many years.

The Harvard schedule provides for only one game away from home, at Annapolis. The two big games of the season will be only a week apart, the Ells and the Tigers playing at New Haven on November 16, and the great Yale-Harvard game at Cambridge on November 23. The only common opponents of the Ells and the Crimson are Springfield Training school and Brown university.

Brown bids fair to have an exceptionally strong eleven this season, and little surprise would be manifested if it should defeat some of the more important institutions. Harvard and Yale will meet Brown only a week apart, and that too, late in the season, when all three teams will be nearing their best form.
