THAT CORVALLIS HAZING

A dispatch from Corvallis last night gives the following particulars of the attempted hazing at the Agricultural College Friday night as mentioned in The Journal last night, and the slaying of two students:

A serious cutting affray took place on the college campus last Friday night, in which two sophomores, John Kelly, of Eugene, and Richard Skibbe, of The Dalles, were severely wounded. The wounds are deep, but the two young men are out of danger.

The stabbing was done by Freshman Robert Olph, of Prairie City, Or., one of the new undergraduates, who was about to be given a ducking by a large crowd of sophomores. The sophomores, about 30 in number, had, by some pretext or another, lured young Olph, who is a powerfully built boy from Grant county, from his room, and pounced on him at a secluded spot on the college grounds. Olph fought hard against the proposed ducking in a fountain, which was to constitute the first step in the hazing process. He shook off first one and then another of the upper classmen, but they closed in on him again. He warned them repeatedly if they did not desist "somebody would get hurt," but his threat only made the second-year men the more determined to curb the defiant spirits of the lad. Kelly, Skibbe and another sophomore named Weatherford closed in on Olph once more, and a desperate fight ensued.

While trying to pinion Olph's arm to his sides, he broke away long enough to draw a sharp pocket knife, yanked open the blade and began flashing right and left. He was like a panther, and succeeded in cutting several slashes in Weatherford's clothes, though the latter was not wounded. Skibbe and Kelly were cut deeply. Their cries of pain discouraged the rest of the hazers.

Kelly is the more seriously wounded of the two, and will be in the hospital a couple of weeks, though he is not in danger, according to Drs. Farra and Pernot, who dressed the wounds of the two victims.

As soon as the faculty heard of the attempted hazing and the subsequent cutting scrape, Dr. Kerr said he would probably suspend the ring-leaders of the hazing sophomores, and it is expected that such drastic action will be taken that it will mean the absolute abolition of hazing at the institution.

The attempt to initiate Olph was the first affair of that sort attempted this year, and news of it came as a surprise.

To Improve a Portion of State Street in the City of Salem, Oregon, and to Improve the Railway Track of the Portland General Electric Co., on State Street in Said City from the West Line of Church Street to the West Line of Twelfth Street.

To Whom It May Concern: Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Salem, Oregon, deems it expedient to improve and proposes to improve a strip of land seven feet wide in the center of State street from the west line of Church street to the west line of Twelfth street in said city, and the railway track of the Portland General Electric Company on said street between said points by placing the track of said Portland General Electric Company in the center of said State street, between the west line of Church street and the west line of Twelfth street in said city, and on the grade of said portion of said State street, and by paving said seven feet with a stone block pavement on a concrete foundation between the street car rails and one foot outside of the rails, and by relaying the rails of said railway track with seven-inch grooved rails on a concrete base.

The said improvement of said strip of land and said railway track to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications for the doing of said work now on file in the office of the City Recorder of Salem, Oregon, and marked respectively "Plan of Improvement of Street Car Track on State Street" and "Improvement of the Track of the Portland General Electric Company on a Portion of State Street—Specifications," said plans and specifications being filed in said office September 23, 1907. To Whom It May Concern: Notice is hereby given that the common council of the city of Salem, Oregon, deems it expedient to improve, and proposes to improve Pine street in the city of Salem, Oregon, from the west line of Front street to the west line of Fourth street in said city, by excavating a strip 36 feet wide in the center of the roadway of said portion of said street to a depth of 9 inches below the established grade of said street and by placing on said strip two layers of gravel and by thoroughly rolling such layer after being placed on said street, and by constructing wooden curbs along said portion of said street.
