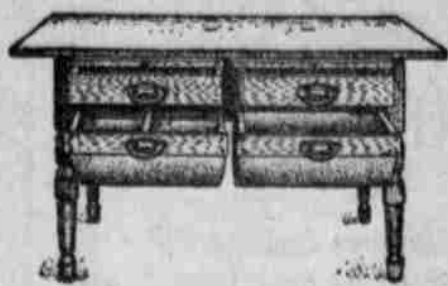

INTEREST IN COMING ELECTIONS

Upon As Straws Indicating the
Direction of the Popular Breeze

Though only six states elect governors this fall for an off-year election will have unusual interest because of their bearing upon national politics and the presidential campaign of 1908.

Mississippi and Kentucky may be added to be Democratic. But in Maryland, which the Democrats carried in 1903 by 12,635, following year the presidential was so close that one Roosevelt was chosen.

Rhode Island Democrats last year elected Higgins governor by a vote of 10,000. But they lost the state in 1904 by 16,766. Of the representatives in Congress last year Granger is a Democrat and Capron is a Republican.

In 1904 the Republicans carried New Jersey for Roosevelt by 80,598. In 1906 they carried the state for Roosevelt by 51,000. Last year, however the Democrats had a majority of two in the assembly.

Idaho was elected governor of the state last year by 30,233. The tariff revision issue, if the Democrats are capable of taking advantage of it, may be a determining factor in the pending election.

General significance will also attach to the election in New York of the judges of the court of appeals by the assembly and possibly of the senate. Among the state officers Hughes was the only republican elected.

Nebraska, Mr. Bryan's state, will elect only minor state officials. In New Mexico, Sheldon, Republican, defeated Hallenberger, Democrat, for governor by 12,973.

The Roosevelt administration and the Taft presidential candidacy are directly involved in the Cleveland election contest because of the endorsement of Representative Rogers by President Roosevelt and Secretary Taft. Because of the uncertainty of the result and the importance of the issue none of the state elections will command a more general interest than the Cleveland contest.

Creates New Division on Pacific System.

San Francisco, Oct. 15.—To divide responsibility for two of the most difficult operating problems on its lines and also to provide for proper handling of extensions now being made from the Shasta route to keep up with the traffic demands of this territory, the Southern Pacific railroad has created a new division which will include the territory from Red Bluff, Cal., to Ashland, Or. The old Sacramento division of the Southern Pacific, out of which the new jurisdiction has been carved with Thomas Ahern as division superintendent, until now consisted of 735 miles of road, including the crossing of the Sierran mountains to the north and the crossing of the Sierras eastward to Sparks, Nevada.

The division now created includes only one of these mountain climbs, that of the Shasta route, over which to Ashland three locomotives are required for a freight train of ordinary weight. The jurisdiction of Mr. Ahern will also include the California Northwestern from Weed to Klamath Falls, where eventually it will connect with another new road being built by the Southern Pacific from Klamath to the main line at Natron, Oregon. This will give the Southern Pacific an entirely new route for half the distance between Portland and San Francisco, completely avoiding the present heavy grades.

The California Northeastern is now in operation for 40 miles above Weed, and by the 1st of next month will be completed to Dorris, 63 miles. Beyond this point a tunnel, now under construction, is necessary and this will probably delay until next spring the opening of the line to Klamath. The construction of the road involves some heavy work through lava formation, with which it has been found very difficult to deal by ordinary methods.

Mr. Harriman, who has been closely associated with carrying out these projects, spent his recent vacation in the new territory that will be developed by the building of the railroad from Weed through the Klamath district. Thousands of square miles of virgin territory with immensely valuable timber and farming land will be opened up here. The new roads run through the government's Klamath lake reclamation project, and to the north skirts Crater lake, one of the world's natural wonders which has hitherto been practically inaccessible to tourists.

PLUGGED THE TARGET.
Six Shots Struck Movable Target 20x50 Feet at Three Miles.

Washington, Oct. 15.—Record target practice has been made by the One Hundred and Fifteenth company, coast artillery, now stationed at Fort Rosecrans, California, which by the way, has heretofore stood in the front rank in the matter of accuracy of fire. In this last case the command made 100 per cent of hits on a moving target at a mean range of 5998 yards and six shots from the big 12-inch guns were fired in 5 minutes and 45 seconds.

All of them would have passed through a target six and a half yards high by 16 yards wide, and for the excellent practice Captain F. L. Dengler will be officially commended.
