CITY COUNCIL WORKED

Had a Busy Session and Talked About Another Concrete Bridge

The claims for the past month were allowed. License to Alex Cornoyer ordered issued.

Mr. Gesner of bridge committee reported it would cost \$494 to cover the South Commercial street bridge.

Mr. Stolz reported that with Street Commissioner Martin he had examined that bridge for an accident. He opposed any more repairs on that bridge, and wanted a permanent bridge.

Mr. Gesner reported that his committee had made progress in considering a concrete bridge for South Commercial street. He opposed a steel bridge. A cement concrete bridge was the only kind to build.

More Light Wanted. Mr. Greenbaum of the light committee reported on changes asked for in electric lights. A change was recommended from Twenty-first and Marion to Twenty-first and Asylum avenue and a new light at Twentieth and Center streets. Adopted.

F. H. Neff had put up \$20 to defray expense of change. Mr. Gesner thought the amount in the budget for lights had been exceeded.

The special committee of Messrs. Stolz and Greenbaum, on expense of constructing a breakwater to protect North Commercial street bridge. Adopted.

Mr. Haas reported from special committee on finding a water supply for city that engineers had submitted a report and it was in hands of committee and they asked further time to report.

Committee on assessing damages for opening Chemeketa street through Clark property asked for map and same was ordered made.

Mayor Refuses to Act. Mayor made statement that special committee on securing the right of way over North Mill creek for the Portland Electric company, declined to enter into any negotiations with the railway company or secure any right of way at city expense. Mr. Gesner said the railroad company ought to get off.

Mr. Greenbaum said the merchants cared a great deal whether the street railway company held that bridge indefinitely.

Jacob Wants Light. Mr. Jacob asked to have the communication relating to the matter read for information.

City Treasurer Meredith reported cash on hand \$9971.

City Attorney reported that vacation of bond of Chas. L. Sumner for failure to keep telephone franchise was not practicable, as the time had not lapsed.

City Attorney Condit reported suit won against city for \$100 damages for injury on sidewalk.

Same official reported on Warren Construction Company forfeiture of bond, that it was inconsistent and the city could not collect. The point was made by Mr. Stolz that it was a contract franchise during 1906.

Isidor Gets a Light. Mr. Greenbaum brought up the matter of ditching on the Turner road between Twenty-first and Twenty-fifth street, and asked that street committee report at next meeting. His motion was to prevent flooding the south part of the sixth ward.

Pushing for Paving. Mr. Stockton moved that the void contract for paving State street be set aside and taken up in a manner that would result in perfecting the contract. Mr. Stockton said it could be done.

Mr. Gesner moved that it be referred to mayor and city attorney with power to act.

The mayor said the contract was perfect enough, but imperfect notice was given.

A remonstrance was read against

graveling Pine from Front to Fourth.

Mr. Jacob said it would be wrong to stop improvement. Referred to special committee.

After General Electric. Mr. Gesner moved to advertise for bids on improving a strip seven feet in width by the General Electric company from east side of Church to west side of Twelfth on State street.

Mr. Greenbaum asked that matter be postponed.

Mr. Gesner's motion carried. Mr. Greenbaum said the effect of this would be to indefinitely postpone the agreement the committee on ordinances had hoped to reach with the streetcar company.

Set Mains Right. Mr. Stolz spoke in favor of giving a thorough overhauling to all water and gas mains before a permanent pavement is put down.

Mr. Fraser said he had hoped to get some system adopted but had failed. The city had no official engineer.

The mayor said he had the matter investigated and the water and gas mains were all in place and the street now being paved would not be disturbed.

Mr. Gesner offered a resolution to fire the Portland General Electric company off the North Commercial street bridge or pay \$10 a day. Referred to committee on bridges on his own motion.

Communication of Long Distance Telephone company was placed on file.

A Dangerous Bridge. Mr. Stolz called attention to the dangerous condition of North Front street bridge. Street commissioner ordered to repair same.

Resolution adopted ordering construction of walk along south side Gaines avenue from west side Summer street to North Fourth street. Also bad walk on State street at Tower property.

Mr. Stockton moved that street commissioner be ordered to put in walk on B street and several in Pleasant Home addition, and on Mill between Twelfth and Eighteenth. Carried.

Fix South Commercial. On motion of Stolz street commissioner was authorized to make necessary repairs not to exceed \$100 on South Commercial street. Adopted.

Mr. Radcliff said the city owed it to the property owners to put that street in order. He also made a strong plea that fair grounds road be put in order before winter to keep it passable.

Same order was made on motion of Radcliff to repair fair grounds road.

Mr. Jacob called up construction of walk on North Hood street.

W. A. Anderson asked for permit to erect corrugated iron building on Court street. Referred to committee on fire and water.

Gas Still too High. Mr. Haas moved that the \$1 gas ordinance be taken out of the hands of the ordinance committee and referred to committee on plumbing. Lost.

Petition of citizens for protection of bank of river in front of city. Referred to committee on streets. Mr. Stolz said the city could not handle this. It was up to the general government.

Petition read for a light on North Seventeenth and B streets. Referred to committee on lights.

Cement walk ordered put in at Tower property on State street.

A special committee of Messrs. Stolz, Bayne and Jacob was created to draw up specifications for all kinds of streets, except permanent pavements.

To Protect Pavements. Mr. Bayne introduced an ordinance to protect paved streets against scattering gravel, rock, slabwood or any other material injurious to paved streets or bridges. Passed.

Petition of Thos. Jory for right to connect with city sewers, referred to committee on plumbing.
