

## AFTER SENATOR BAILEY

Dallas, Tex., Oct. 25.—A movement which has for its object the recall of Joseph W. Bailey from the United States senate will be launched in Dallas tonight, when State Senator E. G. Senter, of Dallas, the leader of the malcontents, will address a mass meeting in the city hall.

Senator Senter has declared that he will offer in the thirty-fifth legislature a resolution demanding the resignation of Bailey, because of his alleged connection with the Standard Oil company, and will ask the people of Texas to endorse this course, both by direct expression on their primary ballots and by the election of representatives who are not only in full sympathy with this proposal, but will enforce the demand for Bailey's resignation after it receives the endorsement of the people of Texas and the thirty-first legislature.

State Senator Senter was one of the 55 members of the thirtieth Texas legislature to vote against the exoneration of Bailey when the brilliant Texas senator was on trial early this year. He declares that the proceedings were a mere "whitewashing" and that no real investigation of Bailey's connection with the Waters-Pierce Oil company, an auxiliary of the Standard, was made. In a statement issued by Mr. Senter, addressed to the people of the state, he appeals for support in his movement in the following language:

"The members of this thirtieth legislature who rendered a verdict adverse to Bailey preformed a most disagreeable duty, and when the full history of that proceeding shall be written, it will be known of all men that in the face of unexpected and extraordinary obstacles they fought for southern honor, as became the descendants of men whose political traditions were established by Clay, Calhoun, Lamar and Gordon. To shrink from the performance of their duty was to earn the gratitude and the unlimited promises of an unscrupulous politician who professed himself able and ready to confer rewards without limit upon those who gathered about him with proper meekness, and heralded the wealth quickly bestowed upon him by the favor of oil, railroad and lumber interests as a badge of honorable distinction.

"My own judgment, which would have been voiced in a report to the senate but for the fact that Bailey decided that his interests required that the senate committee should be discharged without making a report, is that the transactions admitted and told by himself constitute the darkest pages in the political history of the south. The generation which we follow periled all to preserve its conceptions of honors. Bailey's transactions, as he tells them, touch the bottom round of political degeneracy which has been reached in the mad race for wealth

inaugurated by politicians through whose veins course no trace of southern blood. He confesses himself to belong to that class of political money-getters which has heretofore been represented by Danow, Platt and Aldrich on the Republican side, and by Pat McCarron as a reputed Democrat. I will not now undertake to analyze these reputed transactions, but cannot forbear to say that no people will approve them whose standards of honesty measure above those which exist in Haiti and San Domingo. If any precinct or county official in Texas had done the things that Bailey paraded before the legislative committees as evidences of his financial genius, he would have come to instant and overwhelming disgrace, and no friend would have been found who thought the demands of friendship were so obligatory as to require him to apologize for conduct which must cause the hot blood of indignation to rise to every honest cheek.

"Texas Democracy is compelled by this emergency to stand forth and prove to the nation the metal of the Democratic conscience and the value of Democratic promises. If within its strongest fortress our party were unable to maintain its own honor, with what grace could it ask to be intrusted with the keeping of the national honor? If it sends its Burten to congress, rather than to prison, as did Republican Kansas, is it likely that it will be permitted to lodge its national chieftain in the White House?

"I believe with all my heart that the national Democracy is doomed to meet disaster in 1908, compared with which the calamity of 1904 will contrast as a saengerfest, if Bailey shall go back to the senate with no outward sign of disapproval. We are not as yet chargeable with his crimes, because the whole world knows that he successfully concealed them until after the Democratic primary last year. Yet we cannot escape the charge of ratification of Baileyism as a party creed unless we make haste to put the seal of emphatic condemnation upon it. Bailey is even now preparing to assert upon the floor of the senate that his conduct has received the approval of the Democratic party and the people of Texas."

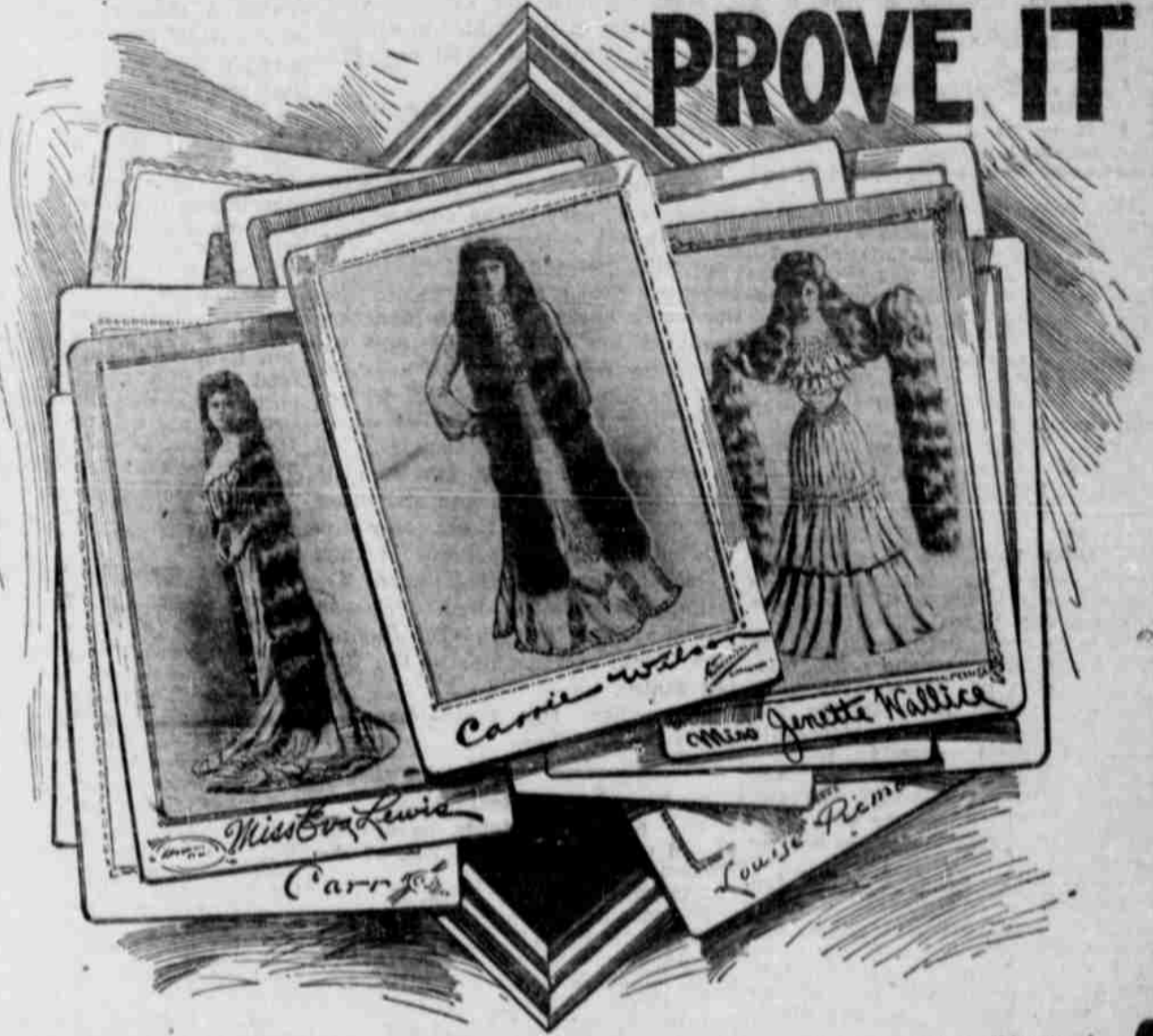

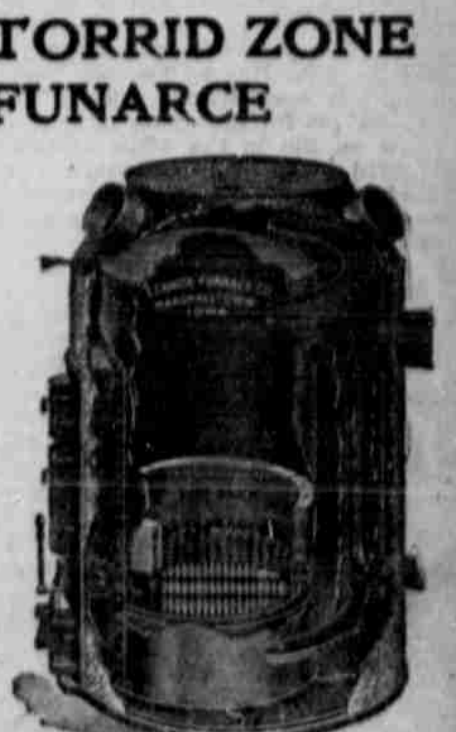
