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NATIONAL PURITY CONGRESS

Battle Creek, Mich., Oct. 31.—A meeting of the executive committee and preparatory and devotion exercises, the National Purity congress opened its sessions in Battle Creek today.

Distinguished religious, charitable, educational and sociological authorities from all parts of the country are present and will address the congress during the seven days of its session. Among those who will speak this evening are Mrs. Anna Sloan Walker, national chairman of the Woman's Purity League of America, and the Rev. Father J. M. Cleary, of Minneapolis, who will discuss "Christianity in the Christian Home."

The congress is being held under the auspices of the National Purity League, an association having for its object the affiliation of all organizations in America that are promoting purity in the life of the individual and in social relations. The federation is non-sectarian, and its members include Catholics, Protestants and Unitarians. Its growth during the past year has been very rapid and its mission is now being fully recognized by all religious and reform organizations.

Legislative matters, law enforcement, social diseases, rescue work and kindred topics.

Among the sixty prominent speakers appearing on the program, including the leading social reformers of the United States, Canada and Europe, are many clergymen and sociological workers who are known throughout the civilized world. Father Cleray, who appears upon tonight's program, is foremost among the Catholic priests of the country in the moral reform movement. Mrs. Florence Kelley of New York will speak on "Wages, Votes and Morals," in which will consider the economic and political aspects of the movement. Evangelist John H. Laughton of Toronto, Elizabeth Grannis of New York, Wiley J. Phillips of Los Angeles, Mrs. M. Evelyn Cropton of London, Dr. Pholman of Philadelphia, Dr. Emma F. A. Drake of Denver, the Rev. L. L. Pickett of Kentucky, Miss S. Callisperi of Athens, Greece; Lucy Page Gaston of Chicago and Arthur Burrage Farwell of Chicago.

With such aggressive reform and religious leaders in conference for an entire week, it is expected that the congress will accomplish much of value toward the solution of many of the social, economic and personal problems which lead to vice and result in the so-called "crime waves"

which from time to time sweep over American cities. In this connection, the charge that the press of the country is responsible for the spread of "crime waves" by printing full and inflaming details of outrages will be considered at length.

Among the organizations represented at the congress are the Woman's Christian Temperance union, Society for Suppression of Vice, American Woman Suffrage association, National Friends society, Christian Endeavor society, Epworth League, National Child Labor society, International Helping Hand society, Royal Templars, Sunshine society, Alliance of Honor and National Council of Jewish Women.

Plan to Ease Money Strain.

New York, Oct. 31.—Fifty million dollars will be paid out by New York banks tomorrow in taking up the issue of 4 1/2 per cent notes issued by the Pennsylvania company, and which fall due at midnight.

In order to lighten the strain which the payment of so large an amount as \$50,000,000 would impose on the money markets, the banking house of Kuhn, Loeb & Co. has taken up, at par and accrued interest, \$10,000,000 of the note issue.

The Pennsylvania company now has on deposit with banks in New York and Philadelphia funds with which to take up the \$50,000,000 of notes, having recently obtained the greater part of the money from the Union Pacific in payment for the Pennsylvania holdings of Baltimore & Ohio stock. The banks have these deposits out in loans, and have had to call these loans in order to turn the proceeds over to the Pennsylvania. It is feared will lead to a temporary disturbance of the money market, but the situation, it is thought, will be materially helped by the Kuhn, Loeb transaction. This firm is also the Pennsylvania's banker, and as payments will undoubtedly be made through it the return of the money

Less Beer for a Nickel.

St. Louis, Oct. 31.—Following close on the financial panic, the people of the United States will soon be called upon to face another national calamity. The price of beer is to be raised.

This action has been decided upon by the leading brewers of St. Louis and the west, and will probably be ratified at a meeting to be held here tomorrow. It is expected that similar action will be taken by the big brewing companies of Milwaukee and other cities. As a result, smaller glasses of the joy-inspiring extract of hops will be dispensed over the bars of the country, and a considerably increased expenditure will be necessary to acquire a "souse" by the beer route.

The contemplated raise is from \$6 to \$7 a barrel. The increased cost of hops and other materials, and the larger payrolls demanded by brewery workmen, is given as the reason for the raise.

Leading brewers here state that such a raise is necessary if the brewing corporations are to receive a fair margin of profit on their investments. It is pointed out that while the price of all other necessities and luxuries of life has greatly increased within the last few years, the price of beer has remained stationary.

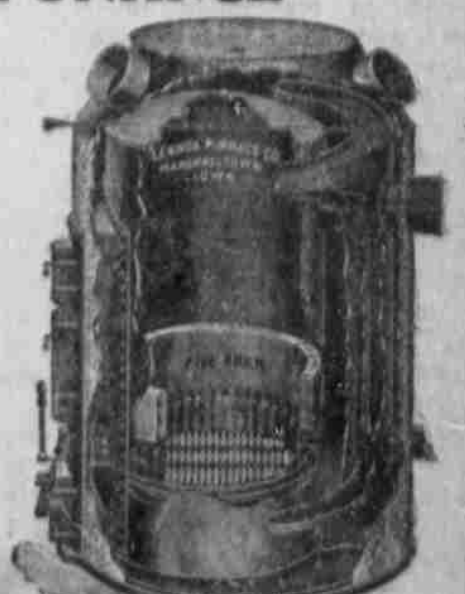
