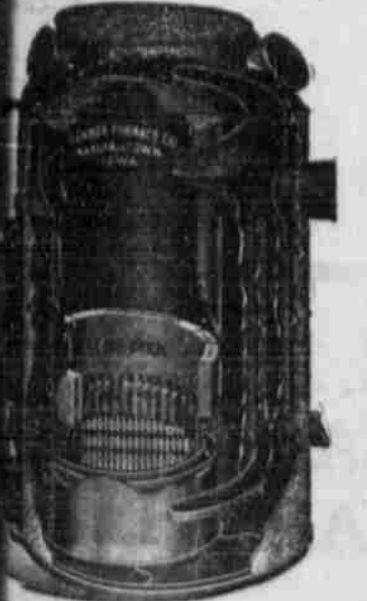

## HAYWOOD TO SPEAK FOR SOCIALISTS

Denver, Colo., Nov. 1.—William D. Haywood, secretary of the Western Federation of Miners, is to leave Denver on an extended lecture tour that will take him to every state in the Union. He will speak under the auspices of the Socialist party, and will address central labor union bodies.

It is considered a foregone conclusion by his friends that his lecture trip will end in the nomination of Haywood for the presidency on the 1908 Socialist party ticket. He will have three separate lectures, in one of which he will deal with the famous Boise trial and his acquittal of the charge of complicity in the murder of former Governor Frank Steunenberg, of Idaho.

**THE CO-EDS SMOKE.**

Pretty Girls at Berkeley Organize a Smoking Club.

Berkeley, Cal., Nov. 1.—Some co-eds at the university are said by Editor David L. Levy, of the California Occident Magazine, the student monthly to have formed a smoking club, in whose membership are numbered some of the most prominent women students of the university. In the current number of the Occident Levy asserts that he will publish the names of the women unless the organization is disbanded.

Although no names are mentioned in the matter published in the student monthly, women well known in college life are said by Levy to be members of the club.

**Washington Heirs Greedy.**

(United Press Leased Wire.) Washington, Nov. 1.—The heirs of George Washington are seeking to recover a large sum from the government on account of lands granted to him along the Ohio river and which subsequently were inadvertently given to congress by actual settlers.

An administrator of the undistributed assets of his estate has been appointed by the circuit court of Fairfax county, Virginia, on a petition of the heirs-at-law, Lawrence Washington and S. W. Washington.

Robert E. Lee was appointed administrator. He is the grandson of General Robert E. Lee, and great grandson of "Light Horse" Harry Lee, General Washington's chief of staff.

**In Court 100 Years.**

Staunton, Va., Nov. 1.—A case which has been occupying the various courts here for more than 100 years was ended yesterday in the circuit court by Mayor W. H. Landis, receiver, entering a decree which is considered final, showing all disbursements in the case of Peck vs. Borden and Borden vs. Borden. More than \$100,000 was involved, and various decrees have been entered by almost every lawyer here. The final decree approving the settlement of the receiver, Hon. William H. Landis, involved only about \$6000. One heir, represented in the original suit as an infant child, died some years ago at the age of 96 years. Nearly every lawyer at the bar for the past century has represented some of the heirs. The papers in the case were so voluminous that nobody was familiar with all of them.
