Labor Commissioner Busy.

Ten stores and two restaurants in Pendleton were found yesterday to be violating the state labor law by working girls and women more than 10 hours a day.

This was the result of the investigation by O. P. Hoff, state commissioner of labor and factory inspector, who arrived here Tuesday evening to look into the condition surrounding the employment of girls and women.

No complaints were filed against

the employers and no prosecutions will be made at this time. The commissioner, after gathering the facts, merely called upon the proprietors and brought to their attention the new law which forbids the working of females more than 10 hours out of any 24 hours.

In each case he found a spirit of fairness and a readiness to conform to the state statute. Owing to the unexpected notice some of the employers were not in shape to make the change at once and a request for a week in which to arrange a new schedule of hours, was readily conceded by the commissioner.—Pendleton Tribune.

CONDITIONS DIFFERENT.

In 1894 Panic Farmers Were in Debt, But Now Have Money.

The recent bank flurry as a result of unwarranted speculation on Wall street is not affecting the retail business in any perceptible degree. The Salem banks keeping open lent a stability to affairs which is very helpful, and as a result is apparent that the worst is long past. Just as an illustration of the conditions as compared with the former panic, it is interesting to cite that the indebtedness at that time of farmers was about \$500 per capita, while today the farmers as a class are not only out of debt, but largely in the creditor class. Speaking of the situation, Geo. W. Weeks tells a circumstance to corroborate this. In the 1893 panic George was deputy assessor, and says that he fully corroborated the statement that farmers were in debt \$500 per capita in his precinct, and a trifle more. Today he fully believes that the great majority of these people are not only out of debt, but have money ahead, and those in debt are very few and in the debts are small. This being the case it is apparent to anyone who will think that conditions today are infinitely better. On top of this fact there are good crops of everything, and the highest prices in years prevail on nearly everything.
