CRAZY MAN HERDED THE CROWD

Imagined His Friends Were Mosquitoes, Secured the Guns and Marched Them Twelve Miles Through the Sand and Sage Brush

Wilson Creek, Wash., Nov. 6.—Tommy McCartney, employed by a party of hunters camped at Moses Lake, 30 miles south of here, has gone insane. He believes all the members of his party had been transformed into huge mosquitoes, who were constantly sucking his life blood. He secured possession of all the guns, and one Sunday drove the party in a bunch across the sage brush and sand afoot for 12 miles.

When darkness came he showed the hunters where to lie down, warning them not to move during the night. The party stayed in the open till daylight, when it was found McCartney had disappeared with the guns. The hunters searched the vicinity for hours, to overtake the unfortunate man, and gave up on account of the exposure.

THE JURY AFRAID OF HINES

Holds Inquest on Body of Murdered Man, But Fearing Murderer Bring in as Cause of Death Heart Failure, Forgetting Bullet Wounds.

Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 6.—A coroner's jury up in Keremeos, Okanagan district, must have been collectively hypnotized by the frontier stories of Stewart Edward White.

At the inquest on the body of Nelson Chance, a gambler, who was shot to death a week ago by Charles Hines, the jurymen deliberated over the facts for the best part of half a day, though the story of the shooting was known in detail to every man on the jury long before the witnesses were called. Then the jury returned a verdict that death was due to heart failure, without saying a word about bullets or murder.

Hines was committed for trial at the assizes, but while on the way to prison at Kamloops, jumped out of the car window and escaped. He was manacled with wrist irons, but got clear away.

GATZERT RAMMED A DREDGE

Bremerton, Wash., Nov. 6.—Alone in the world, a 14-year-old boy, sitting by the side of his dead father's body, was the peculiar situation which presented itself to the undertaker who went to bring back the body of an unknown man found on Bainbridge Island. Yesterday the body of Edward Crosby, a logger, was found on the beach by his son, Eli. It is supposed to be a case of accidental drowning. When the undertaker reached the scene there was the boy waiting for some one to take the body away.

JIM HILL LOOSENS UP HIS TONGUE

St. Paul, Minn., Nov. 6.—Not Wall street, but individuals who are hoarding money, are responsible for the present financial stress, according to a statement made by James J. Hill. He says:

"There is nothing in the actual business conditions to cause or to account for the financial stress. Crops are good, and until the money began to disappear prices were higher than for many years. Neither is there an insufficient volume of money in the country. The notion that Wall street absorbed it is without foundation. A year ago there was enough money for current needs. The trouble clearly comes from the hoarding of money. The impairment of public confidence is the real fault. It has already done much damage, and will do more unless speedily corrected. This popular distrust, as far as it leads to hoarding, is foolish and hurtful. The people should put an end to it by releasing the money whose withdrawal from circulation means business starvation. The financial interests are doing their part. The people must put away their misgivings and do their part. Then the crisis will end."

CHINESE SORE AT BRITISH

Shanghai, Nov. 6.—The Chinese officials are incensed at the refusal of the Shanghai municipal council, which is predominantly British, to permit the Chinese universities to use the public recreation grounds for athletics, giving as a reason that the grounds are for whites alone, though Japanese and East Indians have not been excluded therefrom.

Native persons, comparing this hostility with the sentiments expressed in Secretary Taft's speech, unanimously declare that the Chinese can only depend on Americans for true friendship.

Eight Killed in Explosion.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Kiel, Nov. 6.—Eight men are reported killed in an explosion of the boilers of the German schoolship Blucher this morning, while the vessel was near Murwick. Twenty-two were injured.
