The time has come in Oregon to call a halt on the crude methods of the past and to be honest and decent.

The time has come, under the guidance of Providence, when the governor of Oregon has a free hand to do what is right by the people and secure an honorable management of Oregon public funds in future.

With the new state law requiring widest distribution of state funds in the smaller banks of the state it was wrong for a bunch of Portland politicians to sink \$400,000 of the state funds in one concern that was

noted for being on the wildcat speculative order. Under new state laws for safe-guarding public funds, with excessive revenues and high taxes on all lines, it is a shame and a disgrace to Oregon that state employes and state institutions shall be crippled be-
