Musical Comedy Thursday Night.

As a matter of fact the "Alaskan" is said to be entirely out of the class of musical comedies and to be a full-fledged comic opera, with touches here and there that would do credit to an avowedly romantic opera, the music being good throughout and in some places, exceptional. The story has to do with a mining camp in Alaska. Richard Atwater has been "grub-staked" by Mr. Easton, a New Yorker, and has developed a paying property. Additional laborers are needed and the employment agency at Nome sends a stranded theatrical company, male and female, to help in the mine, this furnishes the comic element. Easton has died and left his fortune to Miss Arlee Easton, together with a glowing eulogy of Richard Atwater, who has been a favorite of the old man. Miss Easton being of a romantic turn of mind, and having plenty of money makes the trip to Alaska to inspect her property, and, incidentally, to see what sort of a man her partner, "Atwater" may be. Arriving unexpectedly, she meets first Smallberry Strander, who has arrived with the theatrical people. He (knowing through a letter which he had heard Atwater read) that she was the heiress determines to win her before anyone has the opportunity. She detects the plan and without having revealed herself introduces her chaperone as the real heiress. Strander makes love to the older lady and Atwater arriving on the scene passes off the actor for himself and makes love to Miss Easton as the foreman of the miners. This pleasant little play at cross purposes requires two acts to disentangle but it finally adjusts as it should be. The entire action of the opera takes place in Alaska, and there is afforded opportunity for most unusual scenes and they are taken care of in an entirely original and impressive spectacular manner. There are three carloads of effects including a real Alaskan dog train and a company of the people used in the production which was staged by Max Figman.


