WHAT WOULD A MACHINE GOVERNOR DO?

It is an interesting question to ask what would a machine Republican governor do for the state school funds under present circumstances? Would he take vigorous steps to protect the people or would he stand in with the state treasurer FOR PARTISAN REASONS?

It is plainly the duty of a governor as chief executive to protect the people and safeguard the public funds at all hazards.

It is also perfectly plain that the Republican machine organs are not advising the state treasurer TO DO ANYTHING BUT HOLD ONTO HIS JOB.

The governor is peculiarly made the watchdog of the treasury and there is no evidence that machine politicians watch anything but jobs. The need of a vigorous independent executive was never more plainly seen than right now, WHEN \$100,000 OF SCHOOL FUNDS ARE JEOPARDIZED.

The secretary of state shows independence in standing with the governor to the extent of ordering school funds loaned as if they were in the custody of the treasurer.

Secretary of State Benson is not made responsible for the keeping track of the state funds, but HE COULD REFUSE TO LOAN THEM AT PRESENT.

Would a machine Republican governor protect the people or the treasurer? Would he expedite loans from the state school funds?

Would a machine Republican governor take sides with the American Surety company of New York as against the people of Oregon? We hope not.

A GOOD SIGN FOR THE SALEM CHARTER.

It is a good sign for the proposed Salem charter that some of the old ring politicians in the old city of Salem limits are opposed to it.

It is reported that the "Lost Manhood" alderman is fighting the new charter tooth and toenail, AND ALL HIS LIEUTENANTS ARE FERNIST IT TOO.

WESTERN ELECTRIC SUCCESS

Enterprising Fixture Firm Has Made Nearly \$4000 Since Its Recent Organization.

The Western Electric Manufacturing company which was organized by Salem business men a few months ago has taken its place among the leading industries of the city, according to a statement as to the condition of the firm, and the net gain of the concern since organization is \$3492.75 which is a remarkable business for the time the factory has been running. The report shows that about \$4000 has been spent for labor which has been distributed among the workmen and office help who all reside in this city. The business of the firm has grown to such proportions that more capital is needed to handle the trade and it has been decided by the management to issue more stock for this purpose. The company recently received one order from a Portland man which amounted to over \$3000.
