THE FORD TRIAL IS RESUMED

(United Press Leased Wire.)
 San Francisco, Dec. 2.—The trial of Tiley L. Ford, chief counsel for the United Railroads, accused of bribing supervisors reopened this morning after an enforced adjournment of four weeks, caused by the declaration of legal holidays.

William M. Abbott, assistant to General Ford, and who was on the stand at the time the last adjournment was taken, was the first witness called this morning. Before Abbott was questioned by Assistant District Attorney Heney, Judge Lawlor ruled that Abbott was not exempt from testifying as a witness, either on the ground of competency—being a co-defendant with Ford, Patrick Calhoun, president of the United Railway, and Thornwell Mullaly, assistant to the president—or because his rights as a co-defendant would be in jeopardy.

Heney thereupon asked the question, which has remained unanswered for four weeks: "Did you on the 25th day of May, 1906, accompany defendant, Tiley L. Ford, to the United States mint in this city?"

The witness answered "Yes," and Attorneys Moore and Moore, for the

defense, interposed technical objections to the question, and to all the subsequent examination of Abbott, which was overruled by the court. Abbott testified that he had assisted Ford in removing money from the mint on that day. He did not remember the amount. There was one package which they subsequently divided into two. Both were wrapped in brown paper and each measured about a cubic foot. He did not notice the denomination, but saw that it was paper money. Ford and he returned to the United Railroads office, and the last he saw of the money was when he left it on a desk in Ford's room.

He said that Ford did not explain why they went to the mint, and that he did not know what the

money was for. He told of his visit with Ford to the mint on May 31. Ford got greenbacks, but did not see them received. The amount was not mentioned either visit. Abbott was accused and the state announced its case was closed.

Hau Will Not Run.
