orchids wave in the wind, their
flowers unopened; in the uplands

hundreds of acres of wild hemp are
stripped; on the mountain
sides the Igorrotes grow as fine long-

but an immense quantity could be
raised on the idle areas, but the

peasants are skilled only in the rais-
ing of rice.
