NEW RAILWAY CAR.

Entirely of Steel and Having Doors in the Sides.

A passenger coach, which is new in many ways, has just been built for the Union Pacific road, and will probably be adopted as a model for the next few years. In the first place, the car is much lower than ordinary coaches, a saving of two feet in height having been effected by omitting the extra story in which the ventilators are usually put. In the next place there are vestibules and doors in the sides and no steps at the ends. The car is to enter at the middle, and the doors there are wider than those in common use. In order to enable passengers to go from one car to another there are doors in the ends, but the absence of steps and vestibules prevents entrance from outside or exist.

The ends of the car are rounded, and it is expected that that change will prevent telescoping in a collision. As the walls are only two inches thick there is a gain of about seven inches in interior space, and this is added to the width of the aisle. Another curious change is in the form of the windows. These are round, not square, and when closed are expected to be absolutely dust-proof. When they are opened they swing forward, instead of sliding.

One of the most important features of the car is that it is built exclusively of steel. Hence it is perfectly fireproof, and it will probably be stronger than the wooden coach and last longer. The new steel coach weighs only 45 tons, and the standard wooden coach weighs 42 1/2. The difference is so small that very little extra work will be given to the locomotive in hauling it. In fact, any disadvantage of that sort will probably be more than offset by lessening the height of the car, because the atmospheric resistance is diminished thereby.
