## BURGLARS WORKING PORTLAND

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Portland, Dec. 14.—Burglars, supposed to be a gang of about 15, raided the business district of Portland early this morning, looting two stories of offices in the Ainsworth building, and two stories of offices in the Russell building. In the latter building they were discovered by Mrs. Edwin Dunn, a music teacher, who has apartments and a studio in the building, and her cry of alarm to her husband caused the marauders to flee with but a portion of their booty.

Six offices were raided in the Russell building. Two of these were dental offices, and from these the burglars secured gold crowns and a large amount of gold filling. A sheet of worthless mining stock was taken from another office, and cash to the amount of \$60 was also secured. The robbers were raiding the offices of Dr. Howard when they were disturbed by Mrs. Dunn's cry for help. Dr. Howard had recently won several trophies in the horse show, and the burglars were preparing to take these when they were driven away. Mrs. Dunn was awakened by the noise of the men at work. She leaped from her bed and gave a cry for help. Then, opening the door, she cried out to her husband, "Here's your gun, Ed; it's loaded, let it drive."

The dark shadows in the hallway turned at that and ran down the stairs and into the street. In the Ainsworth building a justice of the peace office was among the looted. Yesterday both of these buildings were visited by a number of book canvassers, and the officers believe that the same men were implicated in the robbery.

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 14.—A telegram received here tonight from Conchena, Mexico, said that Scott Wise, a paymaster for the Greene mines of that section, had killed three Mexicans in a fight in an eating house. It is reported that a party of Mexicans entered the place where the Americans were dining, became abusive and were ejected by the Americans. The entrance was locked a few minutes later the Mexicans returned, armed, and battered down the doors. The first three men that crossed the threshold were killed by White, who has been locked up in the Mexican prison at Conchena.
