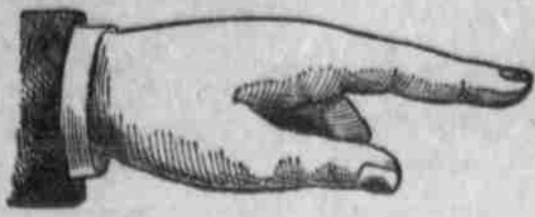

### No Union at Aurora.

AURORA, Or., Dec. 18.—So far there has been no decided movement among the hop growers of this section to form any union or combination looking toward the idea of controlling the hop output, or the prices of same. The hop raisers in this immediate vicinity are well fixed financially, and they think they are individually capable of taking care and looking out for their own interests, and an effort to organize them would meet with small success. The only thing the growers look at is the uncertainty of the promises that some of the hop dealers make, and then go back on when occasion suits them. There has been a number of instances this fall and winter where dealers have contracted for hops at a certain figure, and when the grower was ready to deliver, the dealer backed down, and wanted to pay a less price. It is getting so that the growers will not put any faith in the dealers unless he pledges himself with a cast-iron contract to take the hops at the prices agreed on. One of the most responsible dealers in this section has repudiated his contracts this year, and he will have a hard time the coming season to get as many as he formerly could. Organization would be a good thing for the growers in this district, but they do not seem to see it in that light.
