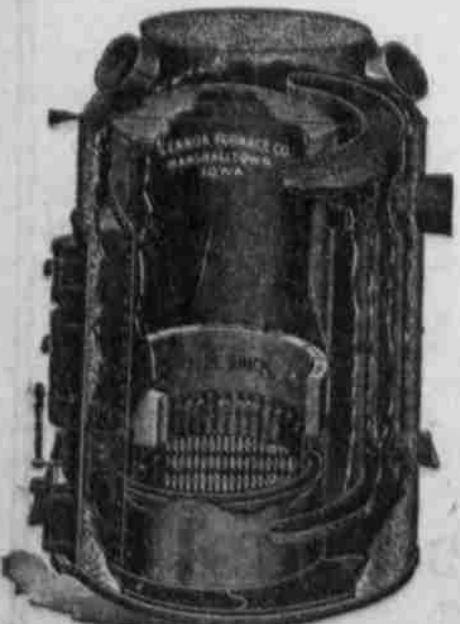
Durst is the German word for first—suitable name for the organizer of the Pacific coast hop pool.
