The blow that deprived the Australian of the use of his feet was a hard jolt to the jaw, delivered just before the close of the sixth round. Flynn out-classed Squires from the very start, and while the big Antipodean did land several blows which stung Flynn hard, and caused his head to rock, the fireman was never in danger, and it could be seen that the result would be against Squires. Squires struck time and again at his fast opponent, but as often Flynn would get out of the ring.

The victor has accepted a challenge to fight Jack (Twin) Sullivan in this city on January 20.

Squires was badly marked from Flynn's blows. His cheeks were swollen, his nose was bleeding, and he had a large bump under the left eye. Flynn had a bad welt under the left eye, which was swollen to large size. Squires was also marked on the body.
