### Many Paying Poll Tax.

H. C. Halley, who is collecting the delinquent poll tax for the city of Salem, reported last evening over one-half of those who were reported as delinquent at last council meeting had paid up their poll tax in full. He will begin another vigorous campaign today visiting all those who have "stood him off" and if the tax is not forth coming a second delinquent list will be made out in a few days to report at the next council meeting. Mr. Halley says that he is meeting with success in his collections most every one cheerfully paying their respective assessment.

The growth of the commerce of the port of San Francisco is shown in the reports of the various departments of the custom-house to Collector Stratton, all of which exhibit an expanding shipping business. The entries of vessels in 1907 aggregated 24,213, as against 26,387 in 1901. The collections amounted to \$3,374,983, but a great deal of stuff which would ordinarily have been promptly withdrawn is stored in bonded warehouses awaiting the loosening of the currency situation. If the panic had not occurred and made gold scarce, the collections, it is assumed, would have been greater than in 1906, when the amount received was \$3,642,623.

## LAWYER MARTIN CLEARED

State Failed to Get in Any Evidence of Guilty Conduct on His Part.

The indictment of Carey Martin for subornation of perjury in the Luper divorce suit ended in smoke. Counsel for Martin made many objections to the testimony, and in the end the district attorney, worn out with the rulings of the court impossible to overcome, moved to dismiss the case. Martin's friends heartily congratulated him and his attorneys on the ending of a case that promised for a time to become serious. Judge Burnett was worried at the almost invisible distinctions that were made by Counsel Holmes for his client, and the blunt struggle of the public prosecutor to bring the matter to an issue on the facts set forth in his indictment. But there was a fatal variance, and the court gave defendant the benefit of it. It amounts to this, that allegations in pleadings cannot be relied upon as statements of fact, but are a part of the fencing practice engaged in by the profession for the edification of their clients. Ordinary verifications in pleadings are not indictable, if not true. A lawyer may allege in his complaint that a cow is a horse, and have his client swear to it as a fact, and that it is true as he verily believes, and it is not an oath, and no one is hurt thereby, because it can be knocked out of the pleadings on a motion, and it is as though it never was.

McNary's Unpleasant Task. District Attorney McNary winced under the strain of his unpleasant duty, and says he will probably make no further effort. The case went to the wall, in the words of the court, for failure to introduce any proof of guilt. The court held that the state could not prove that it was false, because the man who swore to it believed it was the truth of his case. Then the state tried to show that Martin knew all the facts back of the proceedings, but the court held that the state must show that it was a guilty knowledge, and that Martin, with intent, procured Luper to swear falsely, which he did not do, as no intent was shown. "True as I verily believe" does not constitute an oath in the sense of a man swearing to the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. The defense asked a directed verdict, which the court refused.

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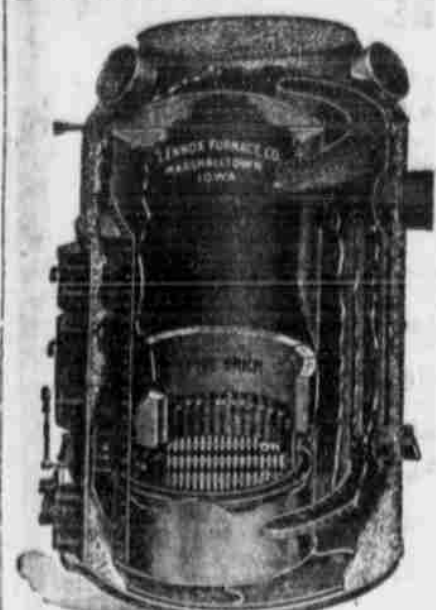
