

PRESS THINKS ENGLISH FLEET WILL COME

Expects British Squadrons Will Be Located On Pacific With Base at Esquimault

(United Press Leased Wire.) London, Jan. 11.—The British press is far from satisfied with the admiralty's denial that Pacific and North Pacific squadrons are to be created, with Esquimault as their base. The subject has been agitated ever since the first rumor of the United States' Atlantic fleet's transfer to the California coast.

"We have no wish to be an alarmist," says the Standard, "but we feel it our duty to affirm that the present condition of affairs is fraught with great danger. We make this statement with a full appreciation of its grave import, and with the ut-

most confidence that the facts we have in our possession entirely justify it.

"The situation is far too grave. We have conceived it to be our duty to insist upon these facts of naval administration which, in our view, constitute a national danger. But there are aspects of the position which, out of regard to national considerations, we have not made public.

"Knowing what we do, we desire to make the most earnest appeal to our readers to devote very serious consideration to the position in which the nation stands, with regard to its naval defense."

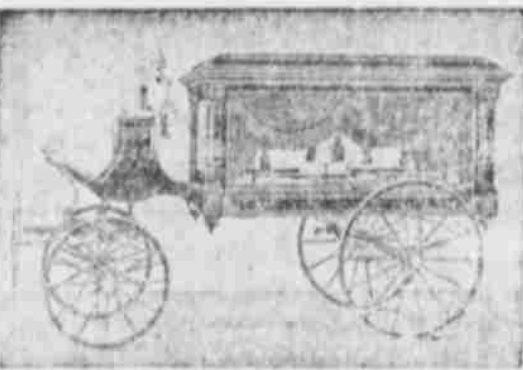
