BRICK FOR PAVING

Many Leading Cities of the World Use Only Vitified Brick.

Brick for street paving have been used in Holland for more than a century, and are used almost exclusively for that purpose today, says a mechanical journal.

Northern England has used brick for the same purpose for over 75 years, with very favorable results. The first brick pavement used in the United States was laid in Charleston, W. Va., in 1870, a town of about 12,000 inhabitants. The result of the experiment proved very satisfactory, and in the year 1873, an additional block was laid. This is still in use, although laid on a very poor foundation, and the street has been repeatedly torn up for laying pipes, etc., and it is still in fair condition.

Brick for street paving purposes is used almost exclusively in Charleston at the present time. Wheeling, W. Va., laid their first brick pavement in 1882, and are still using brick pavement.

Decatur, Ill., also put down brick in 1882, which is still in excellent condition. Galesburg, Ill., the home of the vitified shale brick, laid their first pavement on the principal street in 1884, where it is still doing excellent service, after 23 years of hard wear.

Another Old Resident Gone.
Christian Frickey was born in the Province of Hanover, Germany, August 29, 1820.

He served the usual term of army life, and started for America, September 15, 1850, the first one from his district to venture to what was to them then, an almost unknown and untried country. On Sept. 12, 1850, he was married to Christina Cordes at Bremen, with whom he lived and labored fifty-four years.

They were united in marriage by Pastor Jacobl, the first Methodist missionary in Germany. After three months on the historic sailing vessel "Fanniell Hall," they landed at New Orleans. From here they went to Evansville, Indiana, remaining four years; thence to Camelton, living three years. The next twelve years were spent in Minnesota. Here Mr. Frickey took part in the Sioux Indian war, his faithful wife caring for their little family, and for refugees and his wounded soldiers who crowded their home in St. Peter. Seeking a milder climate, the family next moved to San Jose, Cal., and thence to Oregon, where they have resided in Salem since 1872.

He was a man of wonderful activity even to old age; during early years here he occupied himself with various kinds of work, artistic gardening being his chief delight.

He laid out two additions to the city of 200 lots, now having over 60 dwellings on them. One addition was covered with stumps, thick brush and forest trees. With the help of a band of men from the state penitentiary, the ground was quickly cleared, streets measured and lots laid out where now are many beautiful homes. The other addition is the northeast of the city. In proportion to his ability, Mr. Frickey contributed to various enterprises for the building up of the city.

In Germany he was a devout member of the established church. On coming to this country, he and his family have been identified with the M. E. church. He contributed largely to many benevolent and religious institutions, his life of unwearying toil, self-imposed hardships, and voluntary sacrifices was inspired by a burning desire to help the suffering and poor. He had an exceedingly sensitive, gentle nature, a passionate fondness for music and of a pious ancestry he inherited rare spiritual gifts.

In spite of his deafness which prevented his learning the English language well, he was cheerful and undaunted; he frequented public worship regularly even when unable to understand a word of the service and spent much time in reading.

His glorious hope for the hereafter and his firm faith made his path like a shining light. To him old age was a crown of glory abounded in praise. For him to die was gain. His life preceded him to rest Aug. 30, 1905. His last illness began with a paralytic stroke Dec. 29, and he passed peacefully away Jan. 12, 1908, aged 87 years, 4 months, 14 days, leaving five children—William, of Fossil, Or.; Minnie, of Salem, and the Mrs. Greisler, Mary Caspers and Emily Jory, also of Salem, surviving him also are three great grandchildren, and ten grandchildren, among whom are: Roy E. Frickey, of Redding, Cal.; Mrs. Minnie Mailey, of Medford, Or.; Frank Frickey, Cordes Caspers and Raymond Jory of Salem.

Funeral services by Dr. Solbeck at M. E. church Tuesday 2:30 p. m. Interment in Cityview cemetery.

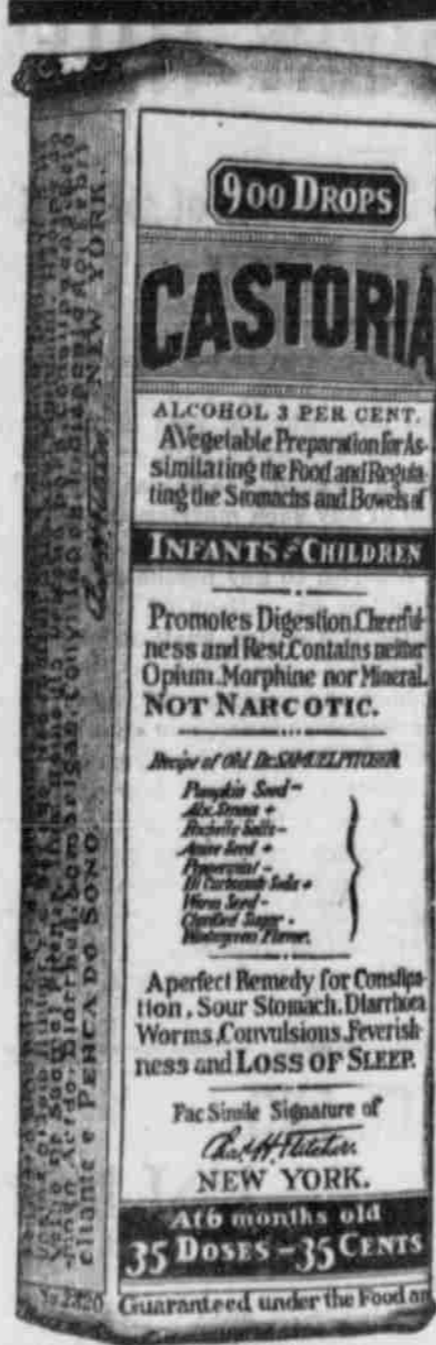

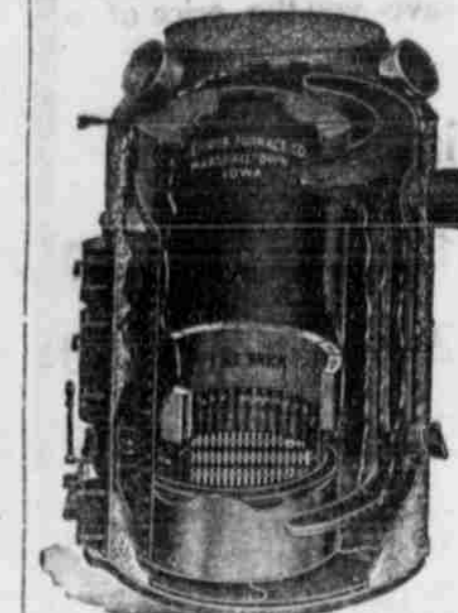

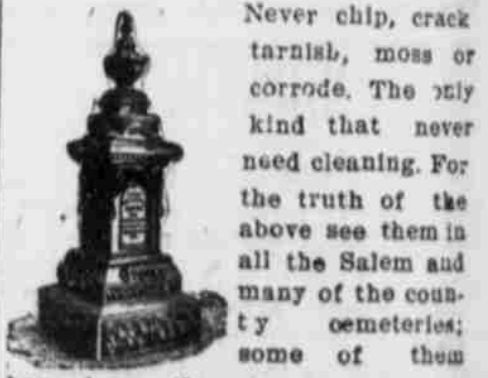
