ARGUES ON EDUCATION

Salem, Or., Jan. 20, '08.
To the Editor:—Once more I beg to come into your columns. Not, however, to make a defense of the university, this time, but to make a personal defense. I wish first to say that it was Mr. Palmer who brought this matter into the paper and not the one whom he insinuates is seeking cheap notoriety. Mr. Palmer submitted an argument, I answered it. Now who was seeking cheap notoriety, the man who opened the subject or the one who answered it? If both were acting in good faith I would say neither, and that Mr. Palmer's sarcasm was uncalled for. The gentleman's sentimental talk on "clover raising," and how he makes his living was interesting, but so far as this question is concerned might as well have been left out.

But Mr. Palmer insists that he is not the author of the article which appeared in The Journal on Dec. 31, 1907. No one said that he was. He says had I used ordinary good judgment I could have seen that he was not the author. I knew that he was not the author, and did not even so much as intimate that he was. But this much I did give him credit for: for going to the trouble of getting the article and sending it to The Journal for publication, with this comment: "The following extracts from an editorial in the Santiam News are worthy of a place in your paper." No quotation marks were used. From this I presumed, and I think my presumption was reasonable, that the article expressed Mr. Palmer's views upon this matter. I was aided in reaching this conclusion by the head lines given this article by The Journal. First head line: "Eugene Palmer submits an argument from Linn county." Second head line: "Eugene Palmer of Linn County Council."

It seems that the essence of the whole matter is that Mr. Palmer has had a change of heart, and that he now regrets having had any thing to do with the article from the Santiam News. I am glad to see him making this change; I am glad to know that he is going to support higher education; and would suggest that he should not send any more such articles around over the state for publication, lest he give the general public a wrong impression as to where he stands on this subject.

Whether this is the case or not, it seems rather inconsistent for a man who stands for higher education by the state, to be sending out articles for publication which argue directly against what he believes.

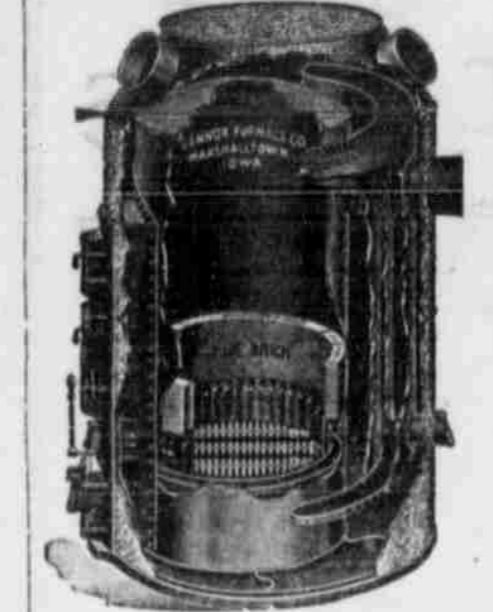
