### Will Deport Chink.

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
Los Angeles, Jan. 21.—Wong Du, who is said to be worth \$100,000, has been ordered deported. His appeal from the decision of United States Commissioner Van Dyke that he was illegally in this country and must return to his native land, has been denied. It is said that Du's father died in a mine in Northern California some time ago, and that Du has been in possession of the dead man's papers ever since.

### Germany Second to England.

Berlin, Jan. 21.—Germany will soon become second in the naval powers of the world, and will remain in that position, according to a statement made by Colonel Gaedecke, who is perhaps foremost among the Kaiser's naval experts in building up the fatherland's sea strength.

Wallace Hatchard, of Gates, who was found guilty recently of carrying concealed weapons, was arraigned this morning in Judge Webster's court and fined \$10.

### Election Matters.

The primary election this year will be held on Friday, April 17, and the general election on Monday, June 1. Initiative petitions must be filed by January 31, and must have 7455 signatures. Candidates for state and district offices must file their declarations of candidacy with the secretary of state before starting the petitions for signatures, and for offices to be filled in any county with the county clerk. The completed petitions of county candidates must be filed with the clerk on or before Wednesday, April 1.
