The failure has cast a gloom over the city because of the large number of poor people who had all their earnings in this bank. The feeling against Cashier Neal, who left the city before the crash came, is strong in some quarters.

ADMITTED KILLING 12

Denver, Col., Jan. 22.—Anton Neroni, who is in jail at Canon City under a charge of murdering four Italians at Florence, Colo., has confessed that he is the murderer of twelve, according to a story printed in the Republican.
The confession, it is said, was obtained through a ruse. Detective Frank Sandesko entered a cell adjoining the one in which the prisoner was locked and engaged Neroni in conversation. The latter, thinking the sleuth was a member of the "Black Hand" expressed a desire to join that organization. Sandesko replied that no one can become a member unless he has killed a dozen men. The prisoner declared that he could qualify for membership, stating that he had murdered eight in various parts of Italy; that four of them were committed in Florence, Colo.

JAPS DREAD ONLY HUMILIATION

Tokio, Jan. 22.—Present indications are that the vote to be taken tomorrow in the Japanese parliament will result in but a small majority for the government against the Progressive and Yuko parties' motion to vote a lack of confidence in the cabinet.

Not only is the ministry blamed for the country's poor financial condition, but Foreign Minister Hayashi's statement of yesterday outlining the government's policy on the emigration question is ill received. Hayashi's words, according to the dissatisfied ones, would give the impression that the Mikado was practically forced to agree to an investigation of the standing of all Japanese students emigrating to America, and to give a bond that the students will not enter the field of labor in the United States. It is the popular view that a concession of this kind would place Japan in a humiliating position.

Comstock said that at a second interview he had with Thaw on November 7, 1904, he produced certain papers which he showed Thaw. They discussed White and others who were in the habit of assembling in the "den" in Twenty-second street.

The witness swore Thaw said he was positive White had in his room a collection of obscene pictures, and that a tenant next door heard girls screaming. He declared Thaw had given him a complete list of the girls alleged to have been victims of the den. Comstock said he placed a watch on the building complained about, but could get no evidence.

The first communication between Thaw and Comstock was admitted without opposition. Most of its contents have already been made public. Comstock said Thaw told him the Twenty-fourth street house was used by a band of criminally rich men; that it was controlled by six or seven of the scoundrels, and that two or three men who knew nothing about the character of the place frequently went there.

STOCKMEN HAVE A GRIVANCE

There Will Be a Further Hearing at Portland, February 10, at Which Stock Shippers Will Present All Their Grievances.

Western Oregon live stock shippers had a hearing before the Oregon Railroad Commission Tuesday on the matter of securing more favorable terms on shipping contracts. They represent that stockyards, corrals and other conveniences are inadequate, that there is not enough time allowed on the attendants' return ticket on the S. P. lines, and other matters. The shippers were represented by C. L. McNary, of this city, and he made a very strong case for them. As witnesses Wm. Steunloff and H. H. Vandervert were called and testified on the above lines. Counsel for the three big corporations doing business in the state put up no defense, but asked for further time to prepare evidence and argument, and it was granted.

The commission went to Toledo today, where Hon. B. F. Jones is prosecuting a case against the Corvallis & Eastern to secure better train service on that famous line to the summer resort for all Western Oregon people.
