DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION

Official Call to All Members of the Party in Oregon.

To All Democrats in the State of Oregon:

The Democratic state committee having met in the city of Portland on the 18th day of January, 1908, has appointed Tuesday the 16th day of June, 1908, as the time, and chosen Portland, Oregon, as the place for holding a state Democratic convention for the purpose of choosing eight delegates and eight alternates to represent the state of Oregon at the national Democratic convention to be held in the city of Denver, Colorado, July 7, 1908.

The state committee has fixed an apportionment for this state convention as, one delegate at large from each county and one delegate representing each 250 votes or fraction over 125 votes cast for Governor Geo. E. Chamberlain at the June election, 1906. Under this apportionment the various counties of this state are entitled to the following representation in said state convention:
