"PINAFORE"

The Popular Comic Opera for High School Benefit.

"Pinafore" was the most popular comic opera ever written. Thirty years ago nearly every theater in the United States had a company formed playing "Pinafore," the entire season and numerous organizations continued to give it for many years afterwards. It is strangely significant that during the present season many opera companies are using it as one of their attractions.

The pupils of the high school, under the direction of Prof. Martin E. Robinson as stage manager and Dr. R. A. Heritage as musical director, have been drilling for the past two weeks and will continue every night this week, and will produce the opera at the high school auditorium on Monday and Tuesday nights, February 10 and 11.

The costumes will be furnished by the Chicago Costume Co. of Portland, and the stage will be enlarged to represent the prow of a ship sailing obliquely towards the audience. The spirit and dash of the pupils already insure that they will present the opera in an excellent manner. The entire opera will be sung by pupils of the high school with the exception of three who were supplied on account of some of the singers in school being exceedingly busy with examinations.

CLEETON DISTRICT ATTORNEY

DELEGATION SOLID

THOMAS J. CLEETON, OF PORTLAND, SELECTED BY OREGON DELEGATION FOR OFFICE OF UNITED STATES DISTRICT ATTORNEY TO SUCCEED BRISTOL

Portland, Or., Feb. 5.—A special dispatch from Washington states that the Oregon delegation, with Senator Bourne concurring, has selected Thomas J. Cleeton, of Portland, as United States district attorney. Christian Schuebel's nomination will be withdrawn and Schuebel will be made assistant district attorney. Bourne gave up all hope of forcing Schuebel's name through the senate several days ago. Cleeton was a member of the legislature in 1895, and nominated George W. McBride for senator. In 1896 he acted as district attorney for the fifth judicial district. He supported Bourne, and is friendly with Fulton, Hawley and Ellis.

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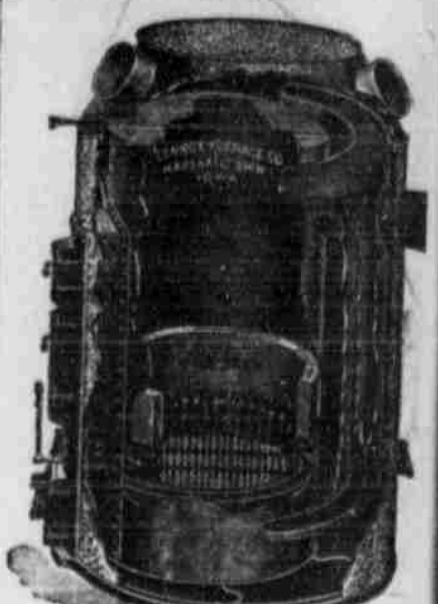
