QUICKSILVER SMELTER IN GRANT COUNTY

G. B. Dennis has returned from Black Butte, says the Spokesman-Review, where the fires were started last week for the first time in the 500-ton daily capacity quicksilver smelter, which he and his brother own at that place. As the furnace is now it will require at least three weeks to get it sufficiently heated to blast ore. To heat it too quickly would endanger the walls which are all steel.

The ore from the mine is to be treated with a different process than is used in the treatment of ore from any other quicksilver mine in the world. The process is an invention of Wm. Dennis, brother of G. B. Dennis, and one of the owners of the mine. It completely reverses the method of feeding fuel to the furnace, and has the merit of extracting practically all the quicksilver from the ore, whereas none of the old processes will extract more than 65 per cent.

Instead of the wood being laid at the bottom of the furnace and the flames rising through and above it, the wood is placed at the top of the furnace and the flames are drawn down through it by currents of air, induced by electric fans. This creates a wood gas, which ignites and is drawn into the adjoining compartments of the furnace, where it passes through the ores, creating an intense heat. While the furnace is 40 feet high, and nearly as wide, and has a capacity of four and a half tons of wood at one time, there is no smoke stack. A vent for the non-combustible gas is open at one side, but not a particle of smoke can be seen to escape, showing that the combustion is perfect.

The new process was thoroughly tested on a twenty-ton furnace, but while the capacity of the smelter was sufficient to prove the scientific principle correct, the economy of it was not established, hence the larger smelter is something of an experiment. Work on this quicksilver mine has been in progress for about six years and \$400,000 has been expended in its development. It has not been a big financial success under the old smelting system. A shaft has been sunk 1700 feet and a drift started on every 100-foot level. Mr. Dennis says 1,000,000 tons of ore has been blocked out. Sixty men are employed at the mine.

SENATOR FULTON WILL RETURN

FULTON SAYS HE MUST DEFEND HIS REPUTATION AND HENEY TELLS THE SENATOR TO CHEER UP THAT HE WILL BE BACK BEFORE THE PRIMARIES

Washington, Feb. 5.—Senator Fulton announced that he would return to Oregon at once to reply to charges made by Heney against him. The full text of Heney's speech was received in Washington Tuesday night, and Fulton at once decided to return and fight it out.

"I am perfectly willing that my record in congress should be made a test for my fitness to be returned," said Fulton. "I must defend my reputation for honesty and integrity."

Portland, Feb. 5.—Francis J. Heney laughed when he heard that Fulton was returning to Oregon to answer his charges.

"I wish he had started back sooner," he remarked, "as I leave here today or tomorrow for San Francisco for the Reef trial. But tell the senator to cheer up, I'll probably be back before the April primaries."
