CAUGHT COUPLE OF VERY BAD ONES

Two men suspected of having committed a couple of the worst crimes the inland empire has suffered in many months are now under arrest here and if the cases can be fastened upon them, as now seems inevitable, Sheriff Taylor and Chief of Police Gurdane will be entitled to much credit for the captures.

The crimes for which the men were arrested was the brutal robbery of C. E. Hedger, manager of the Columbia theatre in Spokane, on the night of January 23. Hedger was held up on the streets of Spokane, and failing to secure any money from him the thugs knocked him down and pried a gold bridge from his teeth.

Being such an unusual crime it attracted much attention and the police of Spokane have been striving hard to catch the guilty parties.

Winslow Bought Gold.

Two days ago a stranger entered the Winslow Bros. jewelry store and offered for sale a gold plate that had plainly been used in a set of teeth.

The bridge was purchased by Glenn Winslow, who had heard of the Spokane crime and immediately notified Sheriff Taylor of the incident. Shortly afterwards in company with Marshal Gurdane the sheriff located the fllow and placed him under arrest.

The other man under arrest was taken in because he had frequently been seen in company with the other, thereby causing suspicion to fall upon him also.

After making the arrest Sheriff Taylor notified the Spokane chief of police and asked for further facts regarding the case. In reply a diagram and description of the stolen bridge was sent him. The bridge purchased by the Winslows is identical with one described. The piece covers four teeth, there being a crown at each end with two dummy teeth between.

The fact that the teeth were sold by the man under arrest makes strong evidence against him and if it can be strengthened by Hedgers identification the case will be complete.—East Oregonian.
