MAY SOAK THE TOBACCO TRUST

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Lexington, Feb. 14.—Announcement was made today that the American Tobacco Company, known as the tobacco trust, will put to a test in the higher courts the indictments returned separately against its agents.

Attorneys say the anti-trust law is upheld through all stages of the litigation, and that if the maximum fines are imposed they will be bigger than the one assessed in the case of the Standard Oil Company by Judge Landis at Chicago. The minimum could be \$5,000,000 and the maximum \$80,000,000.
