

# STANFORD TALKS OF GANTEEN TO STOP DRINKING

### UNIVERSITY FACES SERIOUS PROBLEM, HAVING, SO FAR, FAILED TO STOP DRUNKENNESS AMONG ITS STUDENTS, AND THE EVIL IS STEADILY INCREASING.

Stanford University, Cal., Feb. 17.—Authorities of Stanford University face a crisis in dealing with the problem of drunkenness among the students. President Jordan admits the seriousness of the situation in these diplomatic words:  
"It seems that of late there has been an increase of drunkenness."  
The academic council, in formal resolutions, descants on the necessity of "freeing the university from the burden and disgrace of student drunkenness."  
The doctrine of establishing an inn or canteen under control of the authorities as a sort of qualified and obtainable inn is gaining headway. President Jordan says the present condition must be remedied first. After that he thinks the subject of an inn could be discussed with propriety.

Residents of the campus, driven to exasperation by the continued annoyance resulting from the uncurbed course of students, who have been imbibing too freely, have organized a civic federation or league for their own protection against disorder.  
The crisis came ten days ago with the killing of Cooley, as the conclusion of a carousal at Menlo Park.

### JUDGE BURNETT SPEAKS

#### Addresses in Y. M. C. A. Hall on Subject of Law Observance.

Judge George H. Burnett of the circuit court in a stirring address to the members of the Young Men's Christian association in their lecture hall, yesterday urged them on to good citizenship.

Judge Burnett, in a preamble of his lecture, which was on "Law Observance," stated that he wanted the audience, which consisted of about 100 men, to be good, not only on Sundays and when in the respective places of worship, but on the streets—at all times and everywhere.

The speaker next proceeded to show that law observance was necessary in any community in order to preserve "liberty, equanimity and fraternity," which is necessary as long as this is to remain a free country.

The duty of a citizen to every other citizen was brought out during the discourse, and Judge Burnett severely censured those men, whom he classed as "so-called respectable business men," who laughed and winked at violation of the liquor laws and thereby indirectly aided in the depravity of three young boys who were tried before the judge for breaking into a store and stealing bottles of beer and whiskey. Continuing he stated, "I do not believe there is a man among you that would not rise up and avenge an insult to the flag of our country; there are men who would go into the very thickest of the battle—right up to cannon's mouth unflinching for the cause of the country; men who would make any sacrifice of that nature, but who are traitors in their disobedience of the laws of the land. It is wrong to avoid jury duty, but the so-called 'respectable citizens' do it. There are merchants who disobey the law in many small ways, but it is as Mr. Heney sarcastically says, 'It hurts business to execute the laws.'—That is good argument, when the dollar becomes the standard of excellence—but not until then and that will never be.

Judge Burnett devoted a considerable portion of his discourse to what is necessary to improve the condition of the government and asserted that, no more legislation is needed; there is too much legislation. What we need is men to carry out the laws.

The conclusion of Burnett's speech, which was high strung with patriotism, was approximately, as follows:

"I pledge you, gentlemen, the flag of our country; do nothing that will stain it. Uphold the laws yourself; elect men who will uphold them; back these men up, vote for them and stand by them.

"In conclusion, I say to you, God save the commonwealth of Oregon."

The speech of Judge Burnett was heartily applauded, and the announcement was then made that another good speaker would be secured to render an address next Sunday at 3:30 o'clock.

Judge Scott of the county court, after listening to the arguments of Attorneys Carey Martin and M. L. Pipes, representing the contestants, and George Blingham and P. H. D'Arcy, appearing for the administrator and Mrs. Olschlager, decided that Mrs. Olschlager was the legal wife of the deceased and that the final account was correct. The objections to the final disposition of the estate were dismissed.

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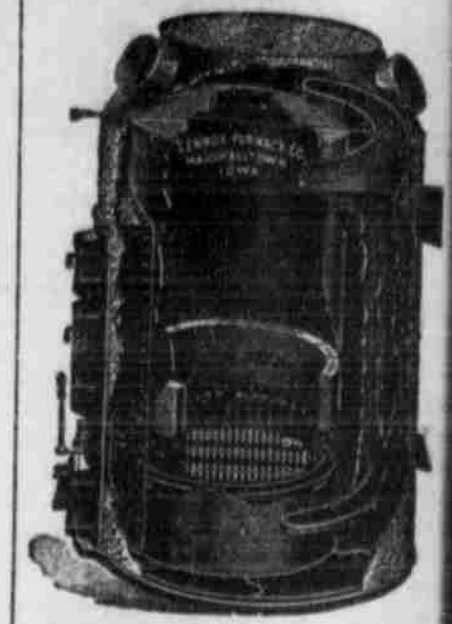
