JAPAN ON THE DEFENSIVE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Washington, Feb. 20.—Diplomatic circles are greatly interested in the curious change in the Japanese-American situation since the departure of Japanese Ambassador Aoki and the arrival of Takahira, his successor. The diplomatic relations between the two countries have been entirely reversed, and Japan now binds itself on the defensive.
The Mikado's policy, so far as it affects Manchuria, has caused great dissatisfaction because of Japan's aggression in that province, according to reports that have reached the state department. The administration at Washington is on the alert, Japan's part that points to a violation of the "open door" sentiment.

Kellogg will be taken back to Chicago, where proceedings against him were instituted.
