Peru has great advantage over other republic of South America. She is a trans-continental country, having a coast line on the Pacific of 1600 miles from which the whole world can be reached, yet one of the great commercial centers of Peru is Iquitos, an inland city on the Atlantic water shed.

The variety of natural products within Peru's confines, adds greatly to her promise for future growth. Her wealth does not by any means depend upon minerals alone.

The government is today wide awake and ambitious. It encourages railroads, it invites foreign capital to invest money in well secured enterprises, and has already entered upon a career of substantial industrial prosperity.

Peru has a population approximating 5,000,000. The country is therefore not so sparsely settled as might be imagined, and the people are industrious and home loving.

Sun Dial as Clock Regulator.

Before the days of railways sun dials were sufficient for most ordinary purpose, and furnished the best available means of ascertaining the time.

The helio-chromometer consists of three chief parts—a universal stand, an hour circle and a year circle. The universal stand, by which the instrument is fixed in place, forms a simple and solid ball-and-socket device, by means of which the makers effect the necessary adjustments in latitude and level.

are engraved the months. When this is turned to indicate the current day and month a curved plate formed on its under side automatically applies the necessary corrections for indicating Greenwich mean time.

The experience of the last two years proves that when once clocks and watches have had their regulators set in accordance with the helio-chromometer observations their indications of time may be relied on for the few days which may elapse between the observations.

The Civic Center in Cities.

Great cities, besides their main civic centers, like Cleveland's magnificent scheme, should have their subsidiary center where school-houses, branch libraries, fire stations, local social centers, etc., should be effectively grouped about some open space, say a minor square or playground.

Outside Washington, the Latin-American cities offer the best models of a civic center to be found on this continent. Take Mexico, for instance. On one side of the great central plaza, facing the south, stands the magnificent cathedral, the entire east side is occupied by the national palace, devoted to the executive offices of the government; opposite the cathedral is the ayuntamiento, or city hall, while the side opposite the palace is occupied by merchantile structures, with wide arcades.

The most felicitous recent example in this country is the magnificent work undertaken by Cleveland. Here around a wide open space, appropriately developed architecturally and with fine avenues radiating to other quarters of the city, are to be grouped the most monumental edifices of the national government, the city and the county, while a magnificent railway station very happily enters into the scheme.
