HOW TO VOTE ON PROPOSED LAWS

Amendment increasing compensation of members of the legislature to \$400 for a regular session and \$10 a day for special sessions.
At present they get \$5 a month for two years—\$120. THAT'S ABOUT ALL THEIR SERVICES ARE WORTH IN MOST CASES. KILL IT.
Amendment permitting the location of state institutions away from the capital.
Decidedly no. HAVE THE INSANE ASYLUM NEAR THE LEGISLATURE HALLS, AT LEAST.
Amendment increasing the number of judges to five and extending the jurisdiction of circuit courts to probate work; also requiring provision by law for district attorneys, county courts, etc.
Sounds too ponderous. Guess we'll vote agin it. BETTER KEEP THE TWO COMMISSIONERS.
Amendment changing the time of holding general elections from June to November.
Kill the bill. WE CAN AFFORD TO HOLD TWO ELECTIONS A YEAR ONCE IN FOUR YEARS.
Act giving sheriff custody of prisoners.
KILL THE BILL; WE DON'T UNDERSTAND IT.
Amendment exempting dwelling-houses, tools, furniture, etc., from taxation.
NO; MIGHT AS WELL EXEMPT EVERYTHING.
Amendment giving voters the power to recall public officers.
No; it is going too far. Better suffer a bad official THAN DESTROY ALL INDEPENDENCE OF OFFICERS.
Act instructing members of legislature to vote for people's choice for senator.
Yes; what sense in having people nominate and elect senators AND THEIR REPRESENTATIVES OVERTHROW THEIR CHOICE?
Amendment providing for proportionate representation.
Sound in principle but hard of execution. BETTER OMIT FURTHER COMPLICATIONS.
Act limiting expenditures for political campaign purposes.
While against newspapers, THIS BILL IS AIMED AT POLITICAL CORRUPTION AND SHOULD PASS.
Act for protection of salmon on the lower Columbia.
Act to protect salmon on the upper Columbia.
BILLS REPRESENTING LOCAL CONFLICTING INTERESTS SHOULD BE KILLED.
Act requiring granting of free railroad passes to certain officials.
This bill was passed over the governor's veto and THE PEOPLE SHOULD KILL IT UNANIMOUSLY.
An act appropriating \$100,000 for armories.
Cities and counties can now assist in maintaining armories AND STATE AID IS SUPERFLUOUS. KILL IT.
Act increasing the University of Oregon appropriation to \$125,000 per annum.
Senator Kay was on the committee and said no specifications were furnished as to what the money was to be used for. BETTER CALL FOR SPECIFICATIONS BEFORE VOTING FOR IT.
Equal suffrage amendment.
LET THE TAIL GO WITH THE HIDE.
Amendment giving cities exclusive control of liquor selling, gambling, etc.
As cities have to do this anyhow BETTER GIVE THEM THE POWER.
Amendment limiting the power of district attorney to file indictment.
This is the amendment to restore the old-fashioned grand jury. IT SHOULD RECEIVE AN UNANIMOUS SUPPORT.
Act for creation of Hood River county.
Oregon needs new counties as fast as they can be organized and HOOD RIVER COUNTY SHOULD BE CREATED. VOTE YES.
Most of the big editors are doing a whole lot of dodging on these matters but as we see it now, the above are our sentiments on the proposed bills.

WHY PARALYZE AN INDUSTRY?

It is reported that the precinct in which the Salem Brewing association plant is located is to be made a dry by means of the Oregon local option law.
THE SALEM BREWERY DOES NOT RETAIL A DROP OF LIQUOR.
It is to be done by hitching the precinct in which the brewery plant is located with several country precincts and then try to carry the district dry.
IT WILL NOT CLOSE A SINGLE SALOON IN OREGON TO SHUT DOWN THE BREWERY.

We believe with Cardinal Gibbons that local option is a proper way to secure prohibition of the liquor traffic in suburban and residence precincts, where public sentiment demands there shall be no saloons.

BUT WILL THERE BE ONE SALOON LESS OR ONE DROP LESS LIQUOR DRANK IF THE SALEM BREWERY PLANT IS CONFISCATED AND RENDERED WORTHLESS?

The Capital Journal believes it is a farce and an injustice to force prohibition upon a city precinct simply because it contains a manufacturing plant which any city in the United States would covet.

We are to cut off our nose to spite our face and help kill our city by AN ACT OF INJUSTICE IN THE INTEREST OF LARGER MONOPOLIES ELSEWHERE.

To drive the brewing industry out of Salem, when the business of shipping beer all over the state will go right on, is senseless and an injustice to this city and its business interests.

ON ITS FACE IT IS ALMOST A NIHILISTIC PROPOSAL AND SHOULD BE KILLED.

Why paralyze any business in a spasmodic effort to secure results that will benefit nobody, improve no one's morals, stop the sale of not one glass of liquor, but really stimulate lawlessness and injustice?
