ATTACKING POPULAR REFORM MEASURES

ANONYMOUS CIRCULARS SENT OUT FROM PORTLAND TO STAMPEDE THE PEOPLE INTO DEFEATING STATEMENT NO. 1—WHO IS WHO? WHOSE MONEY PAYS FOR ALL THIS

Under Date Portland, March 2, Following Unsigned Circular Letter Burlesquing Statement No. 1 and Direct Legislation and Nomination Has Been Sent Out

The Burlesque Circular. Headquarters Pop-Dem-Socialist League, Bunkum Crossroads, Clackamas county, Oregon.

To All My Yellow Republican Friends and Followers:

Brethren—In issuing this circular I desire briefly to call attention to what has been done by our league in the past, and to what we intend to do in the future, as well as to warn you of certain moves the enemy, the straight Republicans of Oregon, are attempting.

After several years of struggle we finally bamboozled the Republicans into passing our initiative and referendum amendment to the constitution. They didn't know it was loaded, and thought it was only to be used in extreme cases—such as might arise if the legislature refused to pass some law needed and demanded by the citizens, or if the legislature passed some vicious law against the will of the people. But we fooled 'em. By making the percentage of signatures required very low it is possible to amend the constitution or call the referendum on a law as easily as it used to be to introduce a fish bill in the legislature.

We already have passed a so-called direct primary law which permits us to register as Republicans, thus getting on the inside, where we can do better execution against them than we formally could. True, this law says it is intended to "maintain party integrity," but that was only intended as a joke—on the Republicans. Then, there is Statement 1, an appendix to the law. We had to lie to get that in, but the end (busting the G. O. P.) justified the means. And look at the glorious results attained by it! Our peerless leader—who in the old days tried every turn and crook and was not able to get even "honorable mention"—Johnnythan Bourne, Sooner—is now our United States senator, doing his best to provide for the faithful but hungry little band of Demo-Pop-Socs in Oregon. And if you will only stay with Statement 1 we have assurances that that prince of hot-air purveyors, George Chamberlain, will be his collaborator in this virgin field. Ponder this well, my brethren, for this is the only way it can be done. And if such a fortunate thing should happen as election of a Democratic President, we will have a true friend at court, and all the Republicans in Oregon will be kicked out—a thing our Johnnythan dares not do openly by yet.

We have several very important measures coming before us at the June election, and they must pass to make our victory complete. First is the Recall. By it, if a Republican in office dares to even think contrary to

our views, we can make him run again by getting up a small petition against him. With this law passed, the officeholders will have their "ears to the ground," and as we always make the most noise, they will think we are really "the people." Second, the amendment which forbids the legislature to change or repeal any law passed by us. This will virtually make ME and my co-workers the law-making body of Oregon! See? Third, proportional representation. By this law we can knock out their beastly majority in the legislature and are assured that our friends the Socialists, Populists and Democrats will get some of their seats at least. It is a great scheme, and I take great credit to myself for having brought it into this Republican ridden state. Of course their are 75 or 80 other measures, but these are the ones we need. Don't forget 'em.

When we get these through, particularly the one which forbids the legislature to amend or repeal our laws, we intend to pass one which we can call the referendum on supreme court decisions and on the veto of the governor. True, our governor at present is all right, but an accident might happen, and one of the enemy might be elected, and so veto some law we want.

Beware of the men who are arguing and talking these things. They are our hereditary foes. They believe in everything that we do not, and in nothing that we Dem-Pop-Socialists do.
