PRIMARIES HELD ON SATURDAY MASS CONVENTION

PLACES DESIGNATED FOR THE SEVERAL CITY WARDS—SOME OF THE COUNTRY PRECINCTS TALK ANTI-MACHINE AND MAY SEND DELEGATIONS FOR STATEMENT NO. 1 REPRESENTATIVES.

The Republican mass primaries will be held Saturday in Marion county for the election of delegates to a county mass convention that is called for the next Saturday, March 17. In some of the precincts quite an interest is taken, and in others almost none. In Liberty precinct a regular ticket will be presented, headed, "Anti-Machine. Delegates for Statement No. 1 and for the Direct Primary." This is in direct opposition to the spirit of the call, which was directed against Statement No. 1, but the feeling in some of the country precincts is very strong that way. In the city wards it is supposed there

will be spirited contests, and there has been an organization at work to carry all those wards against the Statement No. 1 sentiment, whatever it may be. It is not expected that all the country precincts will hold mass primaries, and probably some of the delegates will just be named by the precinct committeemen.

Meetings of the City Wards.
Time and places of meeting of Republican primaries of the seven Salem precincts Saturday, March 7, is given out as follows by Secretary Frank Meredith:

- No. 1—At the office of H. A. Johnson, Murphy block, at 7 o'clock p. m.
- No. 2—At the office of city recorder, city hall, at 10 o'clock p. m.
- No. 3—At Yankee's stable, High street, at 2:30 o'clock p. m.
- No. 4—At the Yew Park engine house at 7:45 o'clock p. m.
- No. 5—At old cooper shop, near Wade's store, North Salem, at 7:30 o'clock p. m.
- No. 6—At the old power house, State street, at 7 o'clock p. m.
- No. 7—At Geo. Mason's box factory at 7 o'clock p. m.

No Organization.
There has been no organized effort on either side the county over, although the precinct committee men have had instructions from the county chairman and secretary to hold primaries and elect delegates. At the meeting of the county central committee, February 5, the following resolution was adopted which makes

a square issue for the coming county mass convention:

"Resolved, That at said conference there be selected or recommended as candidates of the Republican party of Marion county, Oregon for the legislature, members of said party, who are unalterably opposed to Statement No. 1, and who will not take or subscribe thereto in seeking nomination under the provisions of the direct primary law."

A Square Issue.

As the convention is called for a specific purpose, to put up a legislative ticket that is opposed to Statement No. 1, it is presumed that Republicans who favor Statement No. 1 will not care to attend or if they do attend, their presence will not be acceptable to those calling the convention. On the other hand if that broad feeling of charity predominates which should prevail in all great strong majority parties, Statement No. 1 delegates may be permitted to sit in the convention. At all events there will be no attempt to make the rest of the county ticket, and perhaps better councils will prevail and not even a legislative ticket be put up. It is certain that Statement No. 1 Republicans are supporters of the direct primary law and will not be parties to a return to the convention plan of making a ticket. It is possible the Republican mass convention may be a more jolly get-together affair and end in a Republican love feast and the support of the law in general terms, and a declaration for an united harmonious campaign.

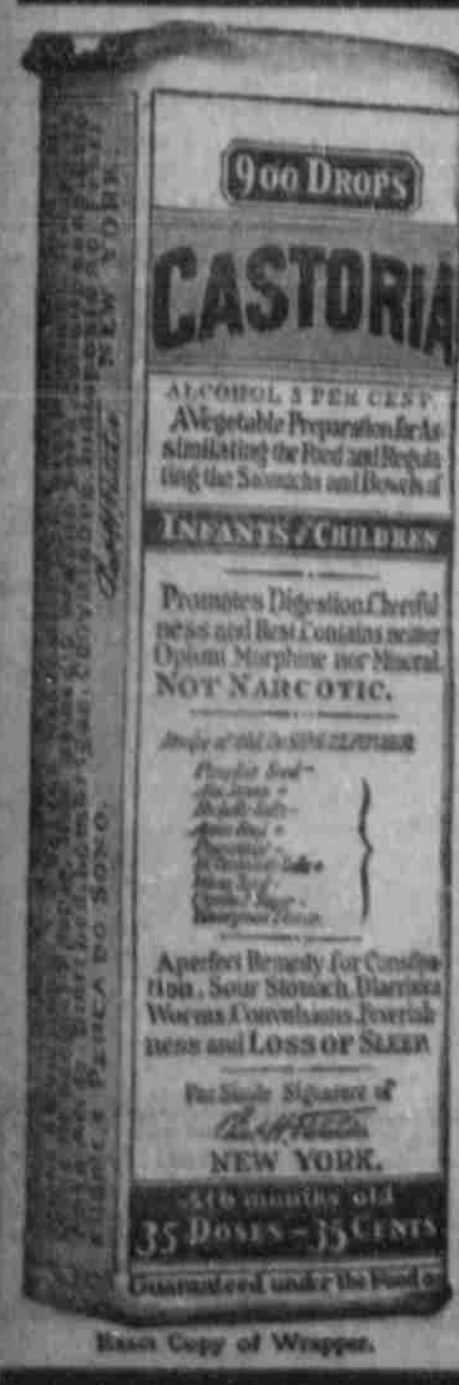
