The state treasurer's report for January and February, summarized, shows following balances of cash on hand: Revenue for current expenses, \$42,127.84; Irriguelbia school fund, \$205,604.86; Income of Irredueible school fund, \$155,153.25; Agricultural College fund, \$7398.10; Income of Agricultural College fund, \$2445.72; University fund, \$4706.35; Income of University fund, \$1769.92; special fund, \$155,266.73; cash summary, \$675,398.67; investments from education funds, \$5,231,123.13.

The farmers of Howell Prairie tonight have a big meeting at their Grange hall to discuss the proposed amendment to exempt all improvements on land taxation. They are supposed to be not so alive to the political propositions of the day as the people of the cities, but we notice that, outside of the labor organizations, the city people do not debate anything, and are indifferent about public matters and proposed reforms. While the machine politicians two years ago largely rode in to power on the direct primary, they are now ready to overthrow that direct primary, because they do not want to go before the people on their records. Out of fear they voted for the people's choice for the United States senator elected then, but now they show their hands, and want a free vote to elect a senator with the barrel, as of yore.

NEWS FROM WHITMAN

The sophomore class of Whitman college has selected for the annual sophomore play "The Gilded Fool," a comedy made famous by Nat Goodwin. The play requires a cast of about 20, which the class can easily furnish. The manuscripts have arrived, and rehearsals will commence at once, for the play will be produced shortly after Easter, instead of during commencement week in June.

Whitman defeated the University of Idaho in two games of basketball last week in the Whitman gymnasium. The first game was rather easy for Whitman, Idaho being beaten 26 to 16. The second game was harder fought, but Whitman won, 20 to 17. Dutcher was out of the games on account of injuries. These two games closed the basketball season for Whitman, and put Whitman second in the intercollegiate championship race.

The date for the eighth annual intercollegiate track meet and declamation contest has been set for Thursday, April 30th, and Friday, May 1st. The leading high schools and academies of the Inland Empire in the three states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho are invited to send a team of six contestants whose railroad fare will be paid by Whitman college, and free entertainment given them while in Walla Walla. The railroads have granted a one and one-third open fare for the round trip. In view of the remarkable success of the meet last year a very large attendance is expected this year. It is the only opportunity which students of Idaho and Oregon have for coming into athletic competition with Washington students.
